Context

The context of the passage is that Jesus was betrayed by Judas And we concluded last week - with 2 things

[Powerpoint 1-Last week]

Last Week

- Even though Jesus was betrayed it was all part of God's plan – because Scripture must be fulfilled
- 2. Even though Jesus was betrayed *let's not forget the influence of Satan* so let's be alert as the devil prowls around and resist him and stand firm in the faith (1 Peter 5:8-9)

Jesus' Trials

So with Jesus arrested - He faces 2 trials

[Powerpoint 2-Trials]

An Ecclesiastical (Religious) trial - preliminary one with Annas (John 18:12-14, 19-24) And a Civil (Political) trial - Mark 15:2-5, Luke 23:6-12 and Mark 15:6-15 - with Pilate and King Herod

Tonight - we're looking at Jesus' Ecclesiastical trial So let's look at who's involved

The Participants

[Powerpoint 3-Participants]

- 1. High Priest Caiaphas v53
 - a. He served for 18 years (AD 18-36)
 - b. He ruled over the Sanhedrin = Jewish Council
 - c. Trial is at Caiaphas' house v54 (courtyard)
 - d. He had predicted Jesus' death in John 11:49-52
 - e. He was involved in the plot to kill Jesus from the start (John 11:53)
- 2. Chief Priests, Elders and Scribes v53
 - a. They'd also plotted to kill Jesus Mark 14:1
 - b. They'd also been sent to arrest Jesus Mark 14:43
- 3. Members of the Jewish Council = Sanhedrin v55

- a. The supreme ecclesiastical court of the Jews like our Presbyterian

 Assembly NSW and GAA
- b. Would likely include Nicodemus (John 3:1) and Joseph of Arimathea (Mark 15:43)
- 4. False witnesses v55-56
- 5. Others
 - a. Peter in the courtyard v54 -
 - b. perhaps the apostle John (John 18:15-16)
 - c. Guards v65

The Charges

[Powerpoint 4-Charges]

- 1. By false witnesses vv57-60
 - a. V57 They testified falsely against Jesus but their statements didn't agree
 - b. V58-59 They said Jesus would destroy the temple made with human hands and in three days build a new one, not with human hands see John
 2:19-22 what He actually said again testimony didn't agree
 - c. Jesus refused to defend himself v60-61 (predicted in Isaiah 53:7
- 2. By High Priest v61-64
 - a. In response to question: "Are you the Messiah (Christ), the Son of the Blessed One?" something Peter confirmed in Matt 16:16 and Samaritan woman at the well (John 4:25)

- b. Jesus replied I AM importance of the words I AM see Exodus 3:11-
- c. So here Jesus is claiming He will is God!
- d. He also says that He will sit at God's right hand see Acts 7:55; Romans 8:34; Ephesians 1:20; Colossians 3:1; Hebrews 1:3; Hebrews 8:1; Hebrews 10:12; Hebrews 12:2; 1 Peter 3:22; Rev 3:21; Matt 22:44 and Acts 2:33
- e. He also says that they wills see Him coming on a cloud (Rev 1:7)
- f. Because of Jesus' answers The High Priest tore his clothes a sign of grief and sadness that someone is in such grave sin
- g. High priest accuses Jesus of blasphemy = the act of insulting or showing lack of reverence/respect to God = because Jesus is claiming to be God He is disrespecting God = the problem is what Jesus is saying is ACTUALLY true!

The Abuse

[Powerpoint 5-Abuse]

Because of the charge of blasphemy

Members of council/Sanhedrin - blindfolded him and beat him

They mocked him - Prophesy! Prophesy!

They guards beat Him - prophesied in Isaiah 50:6

Conclusions

[Powerpoint 6a]

1. It never occurred to the Sanhedrin that Jesus might be telling the truth - He is the great I AM. The same happens today - many reject Jesus - as being God and as being their Lord and Saviour - because they won't accept the truth

[Powerpoint 6b]

2. The trial of Jesus was unjust, cruel and unfair - this should encourage us that when we are unfairly treated as Christians - we're in good company - so was Jesus!

[Powerpoint 6c]

3. Also note - how Jesus responds to these false allegations and abuse - He says nothing - we can do the same. He only responds when the High Priests - asks Him who He was. We can learn from that too! Always be ready to say who Jesus really is - and forget about the insults. It's almost like Jesus is saying - "Why didn't you ask me that in the beginning instead of all these false charges!"

4. Be encouraged by the fact that - Jesus sits at God's right hand - and He intercedes for us - see Romans 8:34

[Powerpoint 6e]

5. Jesus is coming back - see Rev 22:12-13 - and Luke 12:40 - He delays because He doesn't want anyone to perish - 2 Peter 3:8-9 - Are we ready?

⁸ But do not forget this one thing, dear friends: With the Lord a day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like a day. ⁹ The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. Instead he is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance.
