Are you ready? (Malachi 4:1-6 & Luke 1:1-25)

It would be good to have your **Bibles** in **front of you** - open at **Malachi** chapter **4** and **Luke** chapter **1** 

There's an outline for you to take notes - if that helps you concentrate.

Let me ask God for His help and guidance first - let's pray...

#### Intro

Are you ready for Christmas?

[PowerPoint 1-Christmas?]

You may hear people saying they're almost ready for Christmas

- They've bought all the presents
- The tree and lights are up
- The food and drink are in the fridge and freezer
- They've even bought their doctor and the vet a present
- Even the cat and the dog have a present under the tree
- All the cards are sent and the Christmas family newsletter to all the relis is posted
- And they'll squeeze in the Christmas Carol service if there's time after all it is Christmas and there's so much to do
- And they'll try and squeeze in church on Christmas Day before they shoot off to Sydney to the family
- After all Christmas is all about family isn't it?

(pause)

 You see - the problem is - it's so easy to have a "good" heart - but have our "heart" towards people and things - and have no time or no heart towards God and His Son - Jesus

## (pause)

- You might be ready for Christmas
- But are you ready for Jesus?
  - o Jesus the baby born 2000 or so years ago?
  - o Jesus God's son?
  - o Jesus the One sent by God to be the Saviour of the World
  - o Jesus the <u>only one</u> the Bible says who can <u>get you to Heaven</u> the only one who can <u>fix</u> the <u>2 problems</u> we <u>can't fix ourselves</u> - our <u>Sin</u> and our <u>Death?</u>

## (pause)

- And are you ready for Jesus' return? He's coming back one day you know
- And are the people you know ready for Jesus' return?

You see in our OT passage from the prophet Malachi

The people of Israel were a bit like lots of people today

Their hearts are set on other things - and not towards God - and God is not a priority in their lives - they are lost - and away from God.

So, God says through His Prophet - Malachi -

There's a Day coming - like no other day

A Day coming - that no one wants to face - if they're not right with God
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Let's see what God says about this Day - through His prophet Malachi [Please turn to Malachi chapter 4]

## 1. The Day is coming? (Malachi 4:1-6)

- The Prophet Malachi is speaking about 400 years before Jesus 400BC
- God warns Israel there's a Day coming
- It's a day of judgment not D-Day but J-Day

### [PowerPoint 2-Dreadful Day]

- Judgment is pictured as being like a fiery furnace
  - All those who are arrogant enough to think they can do without God and all evildoers those who take no notice of God or what His commands say and those who ignore the offer of God's Son Jesus.
  - o They will not escape forever
  - The Day is coming when the wicked will be like chaff the combustible dry straw that remains after the grain has been harvested (Psalm 1)
  - o Putting chaff in a furnace would inevitably set it ablaze
  - o And it would be ultimately consumed not a root or branch left
  - Not a pretty picture is it?
  - o People might say God is being harsh here
  - But we have to understand God is perfect and holy and He can't accept sin and rebellion against Him He can't look at it (Habakkuk 1:13)

But He's giving warning of what will happen - and there is a way to
 avoid this dreadful Day - see v2

## [PowerPoint 3-Sun of Righteousness]

- Those who revere the Lord's name those who aren't arrogant and realize they need a relationship with the Lord and believe in Him they experience a different sort of heat - they will receive the sun of righteousness
- This sun [S-U-N) of righteousness should remind us of another Son (S-O-N) of righteousness our Lord Jesus who describes Himself as the light of the world (John 8:12) and the Apostle John says in John 3:19 This is the verdict: Light has come into the world, but people loved darkness instead of light because their deeds were evil
- There's no need for people to be walking in the darkness of their sin
   anymore Jesus turns that darkness into light
- As Malachi says at the end of v2 this sun of righteousness brings healing rays the darkness of our sin can be replaced with
  the healing light of Jesus all because Jesus died on a cruel cross
  for the punishment our sins to be put on Him instead of us
- So, people in a relationship with this sun son Jesus will be restored to God and made right with God- so they act like well-fed calves - leaping and frolicking
- It's a picture of the joy of being right with God because of Jesus the sun of righteousness - so I expect us to be leaping around this morning/evening

- In contrast v3 the wicked and arrogant who were burnt earlier
  in the furnace and are ashes and will be even further trampled on
  by the happy hooves of the righteous
- On that Day there will no longer be any doubt as to the fact that there is a distinction between those right with God and those who have turned their back on God
- Not a day to face if you're not believing in the Lord
   Application Maybe you're someone here this morning/evening who hasn't thought about that Day of Judgment. Today is a good day to think about what you will face on that Day
   (pause)

In the meantime - in verses 4 to 6 - God -through His prophet Malachi - points people back to the 2 OT characters - Moses and Elijah

[PowerPoint 4a-Law]

- Moses represents God's Law God's rules given to Moses for the people to know how to live lives that please God
- The problem in Malachi's day (2:6) was that the priests weren't teaching the people God's Law
- God gives the reminder of the Law because God doesn't want anyone to perish on that Day of Judgment (2 Peter 3:9)
- Application God's rules are like our road rules just like the speed sign and the stop sign shows us how we should drive God's Law shows us where we're going wrong it identifies our sin. God's Law may not make us stop sinning no more than a speed limit stops us speeding- but God's Law shows us where we fall short of God's perfect standards and shows Page 5 of 13

us why we need a Jesus - the sun of Righteousness - to fix our broken relationship with God

The question for all of us though - is how serious are we about God's rules - do we just see them as nice guidelines. Do we understand that following God's law would make: our lives and our community and our world much more Godly and better place to live in?

When was the last time - you took time out to read and study and follow the Bible? It's God's Word that brings us back to Him - and God's Word that tells us the only way to be right with Him - is to confess our sins and believe in His Son

## (pause)

- Back to our passage from Malachi 4 and v5 -
- <u>Before</u> that great and dreadful day of Judgment God promises to send the prophet Elijah

## [PowerPoint 4b-Elijah]

- Elijah represents the Prophets of the OT and their general message was for people to repent and turn back to God - or face the consequences
- So, God promises to send Elijah before that dreadful day of judgment
- The problem with that is Elijah the Prophet lived and died way before
   Malachi writes his prophecy
- So, who is this Elijah that Malachi is talking about?
- We'll answer that in a moment
- But first what will this Elijah figure do?

- See V6 He will turn the hearts of the parents to their children, and the hearts of the children to their parents;
- The picture we have here is not just a reconciliation of families but
   reconciliation with God
- When Elijah through God turns the hearts of children to their parents

   a better translation is fathers rather than parents the picture is of
   the hearts of God's children turning to God as their Father and a
   picture of a return to glorious time of Israel's history when hearts
   were towards God like in the time of the patriarch fathers Abraham,
   Isaac and Jacob
- If there is no turning back of hearts that is no repentance then Malachi ends His prophecy with the promise of destruction
- The same sort of destruction that Sodom and Gomorrah received back in Genesis 19

# [PowerPoint 5-Elijah identified as John]

In our NT passage from Luke chapter - [which we can turn to now]

The Elijah figure that Malachi promised is identified as John the Baptist

See Luke 1:17 - And he [John] will go on before the Lord, in the spirit

and power of Elijah, to turn the hearts of the parents to their

children and the disobedient to the wisdom of the righteous—to make ready a people prepared for the Lord."

So, John the Baptist will be a prophet like Elijah in the OT - with the same job as the prophets

And John the Baptist will come <u>before</u> that dreadful day. Let's look at our Luke 1 passage now...

## 2. Before that Day (Luke 1:1-25)

- We fast forward 400 years after Malachi
- Looking at verses 1 to 4 of Luke 1
- Luke writes a reliable account of the time that Jesus is on this Earth
- He gets his information from eye witnesses so we know its reliable
- He writes to Theophilus whose name means "Friend of God"
- And it's like Luke is writing to each one of us as "friends of God"
- Then verse 5 it's the time when King Herod is King of Judea
- And there's a priest called Zechariah he's part of one of 24 priestly divisions who serve in the temple [division set in 1 Chronicles 24) Zechariah belongs to the division called Abijah
- Both Zechariah and Elizabeth are descendants of the first High Priest Aaron and they are Godly people and they're very old and haven't been
   able to have a baby v7
- V9 When Zechariah is in the Holy Place of the temple taking his turn by lot - to burn incense - a sweet smelling aroma for the Lord - an angel appears
- Finally, God speaks again after 400 years or so of silence
- Zechariah is gripped with fear V12

- The angel V13 tells Zechariah not to be afraid and says that
   Zechariah's prayers have been answered and his wife, Elizabeth, will have
   a son
- Notice God answers prayers in His own perfect timing
- This son to be born will be special v14 and v15
  - o He will be great in the sight of the Lord
  - He won't drink wine or fermented drink as a way of being specially
     marked for God's work
  - He will most importantly be filled with the HS that will equip him for his job
  - o And his job will be to bring back many people back to the Lord
  - He will have the same spirit and power as Elijah the prophet hence the prophecy from Malachi
  - o And he will make people ready prepared for the Lord
  - o How do people get ready?
  - Repent and believe his catch cry will be like the prophets of old:
     Repent for the Kingdom of God is near (Matt 3:2)
  - V18 Zechariah doesn't believe the angel so he is made so he can't speak - v20
  - The name of this son is to be John v13 which means God is the giver of grace
  - John will grow up to tell people to turn back to God and get ready
     to receive grace from God
  - God is the giver of grace A second chance <u>before</u> that great and terrible day comes

- That grace is our Lord Jesus John's cousin born 6 months
   after John -Jesus the Son of God King of Heaven
- God with skin on to come to this earth out of God's grace to live
  to teach people God's way born to die for our sins and rise again so people can have forgiveness of their sins and eternal life

Application - God is giving us <u>all</u> a **chance to turn back** to Him and to believe in His son - **before** that **Dreadful Day**. We need to make sure we've done that **BEFORE** that Dreadful Judgment Day - or it will be **too late**...

Back to where we started

[PowerPoint 6-Ready?]

Are you ready for Christmas?

## [PowerPoint 7a-Repent]

If you haven't already turned back to God and repented - and said sorry to God for disobeying His rules - then you need to do that - <u>before</u> this dreadful day of judgment comes - there are **only 2 options** available to you:

[PowerPoint 7b-Reject]

- A. Either Reject God and be burnt up in judgment when Jesus' returns and then you will be away from the presence of God forever

  [PowerPoint 7b-Return]
  - B. Or turn back to God and believe in His grace in sending Jesus and live with God forever

If you don't believe in Jesus already

I invite you to say this prayer with me now - and give your heart to Him - before it's too late

In fact - let us all say this prayer together:

Dear God I have sinned

I know I have offended you in many ways

I am so sorry

I believe that Jesus suffered and died for my sins

He paid my debt in full and rose again

Jesus, I believe in you

And I thank you for what you've done for me

Please save me from the penalty of my sins

And give me a new birth

And the power to live for you

Thank you for this offer to spend eternity with you

Amen

For those who already believe in Jesus

Are you ready for Jesus' return - is your focus on Him or on the trappings of this time of year - remember you don't know when Jesus will return - Jesus says no one knows the hour of His return (Mark 10:30-32) - and He will return like a thief in the night (Matt 24:43 and 1 Thes 5:2)

#### [PowerPoint 8-1 Peter 3:15]

And have you made ready others to meet Jesus - before He returns?

As Peter says in 1 Peter 3:15: Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect,

Or maybe you're silent - and lost your voice like Zechariah - (pause)

In a sense we're all - Moses' and Elijah's - reminding ourselves to look at God's Word and His Law - and reminding ourselves and others to repent and turn back to God - before it's too late

So, as we approach Christmas - it's a great opportunity to make people ready to meet Jesus for the 1<sup>st</sup> time - and a great opportunity to remind ourselves and others that Jesus' will come a 2<sup>nd</sup> time - to take His people home -

#### [PowerPoint 9-Heb 9:27-28]

But let's ponder on these verses from Hebrews 9:27-28 as we finish up

27 Just as people are destined to <u>die once</u>, and after that to face

<u>judgment</u>, <sup>28</sup> so Christ was sacrificed once to take away the sins of many;

and he will appear <u>a second time</u>, not to bear sin, but to <u>bring</u> <u>salvation</u> to those who are waiting for him.

So, we're all going to die and face judgment

Jesus dies for our sins to be taken away - if we care to believe that

But when Jesus comes the 2<sup>nd</sup> time - he won't be dying for sins - He'll be taking those who believe in Him with Him

But you must believe in Him to be taken with Him - no more chances available
The question is - are you ready?
