• Just a quick recap where we got up to

[PowerPoint 1-David and Saul]

- David has been on the run from King Saul for some time
- King Saul is out to kill David
- David has been flying solo without God in chapters 27 and 29
- And he ran off to the Philistine territory to escape Saul
- And David befriended the Philistine King Achish

[PowerPoint 2-Ziklag]

Last week - chapter 30 - David and his men were sent away by the
 Achish back to the town of Ziklag - because the Philistine commanders
 didn't want David fighting with them

Intro

• As we pick up the story today in chapter 31

[PowerPoint 3-Town burnt down]

- When David and his men returned to Ziklag they found that the
 Amalekites had burnt Ziklag to the ground (v1) and taken everyone away
 all the men's families (v2-3)
- Now, the Amalekites were arch enemies of Israel from way back
 - o They were extremely wicked people
 - Back in Exodus chapter 37? The Amalekites had attacked the
 Israelites when they were coming out of Egypt
 - And in 1 Sam 15? Saul was told by God to totally wipe out the
 Amalekites but Saul didn't fully obey God and so here they are
 again attacking
 - All because Saul didn't fully obey God's instructions which is why
 God rejected Saul and anointed David as the next King
- Any way when David and his men saw Ziklag burnt to the ground, they
 were devastated
- The Amalekites have even taken David's two wives away Ahinoam and Abigail
- Imagine how everyone felt?
- It would be like the bush fires at the moment where people return to their home and its burnt to the ground everything gone

- For David as the leader the matter is worse in that his men blame
 him it was David's idea to go to the land of the Philistines and take
 600 men with him
- As the leader he hadn't left enough protection in his town to protect
 all the women and children and now they're all gone
- The men are so angry with David v6 they're ready to stone him
- Illustration when my children were much younger in the 90s there were bush fires in the Gosford area and we live near the bush as some of you know One morning I woke up to the sound of voices just over the fence it turned out to be some bush care volunteers tidying up the bush but they'd had left all these piles of dead dry branches
- I asked them if they were going to take the dead branches away they said no that they were just making the bush tidier
- I think I'm right in saying that dead branches burn quicker and easier than growing green branches
- I have to say I was pretty angry the first thing I thought of was someone throwing a cigarette into these piles of dry branches and up goes the fence and then our house - and that puts our family in danger
- Nothing gets us upset quicker than knowing our family are in danger
- That's how David's men felt
- Now <u>David's</u> in danger because the men are <u>so</u> angry
- What will he do?

[PowerPoint 4-Where do we find strength]

 Where do we find strength - when we're in trouble - especially when we've got no strength left, ourselves?

- Perhaps you've lost a loved one and the pain and loss and loneliness are so unbearable
- Or perhaps you or a loved one have been diagnosed with a serious
 illness and the future is just so uncertain
- Or what about the people affected by the bushfires at the moment
 who've lost everything where do they find their strength?
- Or perhaps you've been in or are currently in a difficult or toxic
 relationship and you can't see a way forward
- Or perhaps you've had a number of trials one after another and the last trial is the final straw - and you're completely spent and traumatized - there's nothing left inside you to keep going
- I would imagine that's how David felt?
 - o He's tried to do the right thing for the Lord
 - o God has chosen Him as the next anointed King
 - But since then life hasn't been easy
 - o The current King Saul has been out to kill him ever since
 - David's even had 2 occasions when he could have taken Saul out but he respected the Lord that is was the Lord's job to remove
 Saul and install David as King
 - o He's been on the run for so long
 - He's even tried going to another country but that didn't work out
 either
 - And now he comes back to the whole town burnt down and everyone taken captive
 - And of course, now he gets all the blame

- But notice David's reaction here...
 - He doesn't complain
 - o He doesn't feel sorry for himself
 - o He doesn't blame anyone
 - He doesn't blame God
 - I'm pretty sure I'd be complaining, and feeling sorry for myself and blaming God and saying it's not fair
 - Jesus never said our lives would be easy or fair did he he wasn't
 a false recruiter?

[PowerPoint 5-V6]

- o Look what David did at the end of verse 6 the key verse for me
- o But David found strength in the Lord his God
 - It literally means to bind or tie closely to the Lord like we're bound together with the Lord - so we're not relying on ourselves - because there is nothing left in us
- Now it's all very well to say David found strength in the Lord
- That can sound a bit abstract
- It would be helpful for us to understand <u>practically</u> what <u>finding</u>
 strength in the Lord looks like?
- So, let's see...

[PowerPoint 6-Heading]

Handing the Problem to God (1 Samuel 30:7-8)

Firstly, finding strength in the Lord looks like - handing the problem to God - that's in verses 7 and 8.

[PowerPoint 6a-handing problem to God]

- Notice what David does in v7 He comes back to God
- And he hands the problem straight to God
- He asks Abiathar, the priest, to bring the ephod (Urim and Thummim) and he inquires of the Lord
- David asks God (v8) shall I pursue the raiding party (of Amalekites)?
- Will I overtake them?
- And the answer is Yes
- How do we know if God's answer is yes or no, today?
- We don't have an Ephod?
- Well there are number of ways...
 - o **Prayer** is **one way**, especially when you're unsure of *G*od's will for your life. "If any of you lacks wisdom, he should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to him" (<u>James 1:5</u>). "Be still before the Lord and wait patiently for Him" (<u>Psalm 37:7</u>). If you don't know what to pray, you can always personalize and pray verses such as, "Show <u>me</u> the way I should go, for to You I lift up <u>my</u> soul" (<u>Psalm 143:8</u>) and, "Guide <u>me</u> in Your truth and teach <u>me</u>" (Psalm 25:5).
 - The main way God speaks to us is through His Word. "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness" (2 Timothy 3:16). If Scripture commands something of us, there's no need to hesitate and wonder if it's really God's will for us. He cares so much about us that He already gave a plain and clear guidebook to life the Bible. "Your Word is a

- lamp to my feet and a light for my path" (Psalm 119:105). "The Law of the Lord is perfect, reviving the soul. The statutes of the Lord are trustworthy, making wise the simple" (Psalm 19:7).
- Also, God never contradicts Himself, so He'll never ask you to do something that contradicts Scripture. He will never ask you to sin. He will never ask you to do something Jesus wouldn't do. We need to immerse ourselves in the Bible, so we will know which actions meet God's standards. "Do not let this Book of the Law depart from your mouth: meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do everything that is written in it" (Joshua 1:8).
- O As Christians, we also have the Holy Spirit to discern what is, or is not, God's will for our lives. "The Spirit of truth . . . will guide you into all truth" (John 16:13). Sometimes the Holy Spirit will either agitate our conscience if we're making a wrong decision, or He will pacify and encourage us when we're leaning toward the right decision. [that's generally the way the Lord speaks to me]. Even if He doesn't intervene in such noticeable ways, we can have confidence that He's always in charge. Sometimes God will alter a situation without us even realizing He has acted. "The Lord will guide you always" (Isaiah 58:11).
- o If God is calling you to take a <u>leap of faith</u>, be encouraged by His presence. "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be terrified, do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go" (<u>Joshua 1:9</u>). And remember, "Cast all your anxiety on Him because He cares for you" (<u>1 Peter 5:7</u>). "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on

your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He will direct your paths" (Proverbs 3:5-6).

- Back to our passage Handing the problem to God brings hope and reenergizes David and his men - and it's the same for us. Hope always reenergizes us too!
- Notice in all of this who are we relying on?
- We are relying on God's strength with the problem not our strength

Being content in every situation (1 Samuel 30:6, 21-25, Phil 4:10-12)

Second, finding strength in the Lord looks like - being content in every situation

[PowerPoint 6b-Being content in every situation]

- In this passage people are very fickle
- One minute, David is the villain he's got them into so much bother they're
 ready to stone him (v6)
- A while later after God has helped David win the victory over the
 Amalekites David is the best thing since sliced bread and some of the
 fighting men don't want to share the spoils with the men who were too
 tired to continue
- Notice how David stays consistent throughout the whole affair.
 - o He handles the situation by completely trusting God
 - He trusts God when he has nothing and the men are ready to stone him
 - And he trusts God when he's in the <u>battle</u>

- And he trusts God when he makes the decision with the spoils everyone gets an equal share
- Isn't that the way God works? God does not show

 favouritism (Romans 2:11) and we're all equal in Jesus There

 is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there

 male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus.

 (Galatians 3:28)
- God shows grace equally to everyone and Jesus is available to everyone
- Sometimes we can be like David's men who stayed behind we're too tired
 to continue
- And sometimes we can be like David's men who fought the battle and didn't want to share and we can be selfish and greedy thinking it's all of us and none of God
- We need to take a leaf out of the Apostle Paul's book and learn to be content in all things
- Paul in his life suffered shipwrecks, imprisonment and persecution but in
 Phil 4:12 he says ¹² I know what it is to be in need, and I know what it
 is to have plenty. I have learned the secret of being content in any and
 every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or
 in want.
- Finding strength in God is saying I'm content in your capable hands God
 - o if I end up with nothing I trust you God -
 - o if I end up with plenty I trust you God -

- o all that matters are that I have a relationship with you God and you're with me all the way through my life
- The verse I became a Christian on when I was in a desperate situation in
 my life was Rom 8:31 if God is for me, who can be against me I've
 got the BEST on my side everyone else against me can't match God He's
 the BEST that's David's attitude here and it should be ours
- The way I try to explain it to people is like this
 - We have 2 types of relationships
 - A vertical relationship with God that's the most important relationship - and must be maintained always - and God will always be there at His end
 - And horizontal relationships which are human relationships and they unfortunately depend on sinful human beings like each of us - so from time to time - either we mess up the relationship or the other person does - or both of us do
 - But the important thing is to keep the vertical relationship with God going all the time - and He will help with everything - in His own way and in His own time

Acknowledging that God is in control of everything (1 Sam 30:23-25, Phil 4:13)

Thirdly, finding strength in the Lord looks like - acknowledging that God is in control of everything

[PowerPoint 6c-God in control]

- As we look at David's situation we can see that God is so in control
 of everything here
- First off back in chapter 29 God arranged for David to be removed from this compromising position where he was marching in the Philistine army and ready to attack his own people, Israel
- God knows that there will be a battle between the Philistines and the Israelites (in the next chapter, 1 Sam 31) and it will end up with Saul being killed and so God arranges for David to be out of the picture
- So even though David arrives back in Ziklag to a terrible situation God
 has prevented David from being involved in the battle that the Israelites
 will lose
- Notice God is in control of the battle against the Amalekites in this chapter too
- God provided help in the form of an Egyptian slave a slave of an Amalekite who was left behind because he was sick this slave led
 David and his men to the Amalekites' camp where the Amalekites are complacent thinking they're job was done and are in the middle of partying
- A warning for us <u>not</u> to be complacent see 1 Cor 10:12 so, if you think you are standing firm, be careful that you don't fall!
- David and his 600 men are well outnumbered but God gives them the
 victory and more plunder
- God blesses David and his men and everything is restored to David and his men - and more besides

- David finds strength in this chapter because he knows God is in control of everything - David has stopped flying solo and come back to trusting God in everything
- That's <u>where</u> we can find our strength by saying to ourselves God is in control why am I anxious? Why am I giving up? Why am I doubting? Why am I afraid?
- If God created everything just by speaking?
- If God sent His son to fix our sin and give us eternal life?
- Isn't it logical that **He cares about every detail** isn't that how **God** is **consistent** the same yesterday, today and forever? (Hebrews 13:8)
- Isn't that why the Apostle Paul can say in Phil 4:13 I can do all this through him who gives me strength
- Will that be <u>our mantra</u> as we face the next thing when we have no more strength left can we join Paul and say it's ok I can do this because the Lord will give me the strength?

Conclusion (Pointing to Jesus)

[PowerPoint 7-Conclusion]

To **finish up** then:

We all have a problem we can't fix - which is our sin

No matter what strength and wisdom we have humanly speaking - it's not enough to fix our sin

Only Jesus can fix our sin

[PowerPoint 7a-Victory]

Just like God won the victory for David and his men over the wicked

Amalekites - Jesus won the victory over sin by His death on a cruel cross and He won the victory over the punishment of our sin - which is death and
separation from God forever - through His glorious resurrection

So, Jesus has defeated sin and death, once and for all. If we care to believe in Him.

[PowerPoint 7b-Rescue]

David rescued his people from captivity

Jesus rescued His people from captivity of sin.

[PowerPoint 7c-Share the Spoils]

And just like **David cared** for **everyone** - not just himself - and **shared** the **spoils** of his victory

Jesus - sacrificed His life for all - and shares the spoils of His victory

- We have forgiveness
- We have eternal life promised and to look forward to

<u>And</u> He has given us the Holy Spirit and it's the Holy Spirit that supplies our spiritual gifts (the spoils of Jesus' victory) for each member of the body of Christ - which is His church - and so <u>each one of us</u> can use those spiritual gifts to encourage and help and strengthen one another
