The Light of the World (Isaiah 42:1-9 & Luke 2:22-40)

It would be great to have your Bibles open at Isaiah 42:1-9 and then Luke 2:22-40.

There are Bibles in front of you - if you want to follow where we're going - and there's a sermon outline - if you're a person who likes to take notes.

Let me ask God - to help our understanding - before we begin

Intro/Darkness versus Light

• Are you afraid of the dark?

[PowerPoint 1-Dark?]

- Why are people afraid of the dark?
 (pause)
- Because they can't see what's around them
- It's like they're blind
- In our OT reading in the time of Isaiah
- People were in darkness but not physical darkness
- Spiritual darkness

[PowerPoint 2-Spiritual darkness]

- Spiritual darkness is the opposite to the light of God's love for people
- The Bible often uses the picture of darkness and light to contrast what is bad with what is good
 - For example At the beginning of time, God created light to dismiss the darkness and chaos that was over all the earth Page 1 of 11

- (<u>Genesis 1:1-5</u>). Then **God created** the **lights** in the sky, the **sun**, **moon**, and **stars** (<u>Genesis 1:14-16</u>). As light itself and the source of light, **God** had only to **speak** and **light came** into being.
- The Bible describes the wicked as in darkness Proverbs 2:13
 says those who have left the straight paths are walking in dark ways
- The Bible describes judgment as darkness Then the LORD said to Moses, "Stretch out your hand toward the sky so that darkness spreads over Egypt--darkness that can be felt." (Exodus 10:21)
- o The Bible describes death as darkness (Psalm 88:12)
- The light that is God is the opposite of the darkness that is evil.

 The light of God is His holiness, righteousness, and goodness, which is in contrast to the darkness of evil and sin.
 - **Light** is part of the **essence** of **God**. He is completely, unreservedly, absolutely **holy**, with **no sin**, and **no hint of injustice**.
- Light is often associated with good things about God
 - Like His Word Your word is a lamp for my feet, a light on my path. (<u>Psalm 119:105</u>),
 - Like salvation (<u>Isaiah 9:2</u>) [people walking in darkness have seen a light],
 - Like goodness (Genesis 1:4) [God saw light was good]
 - Like His commandments (<u>Proverbs 6:23</u>) [your command is a lamp, your teaching a light]
 - Like life (Psalm 56:13) [God is the light of life].

- o In <u>Psalm 27:1</u> David declares God to be his light and salvation. God was the light that guided and led David through dark and difficult times of persecution. Darkness is the emblem of distress, trouble, perplexity, and sorrow. Light is the opposite of these. God <u>showered</u> David with such light that he was filled with confidence and his fears were removed.
- Whereas as Proverbs 4:19 says: the way of the wicked is like deep darkness
- This contrast between darkness and light leads the Apostle John to declare in John 3:19-20: ¹⁹This is the verdict: Light has come into the world, but people loved darkness instead of light because their deeds were evil. ²⁰Everyone who does evil hates the light, and will not come into the light for fear that their deeds will be exposed.
- Spiritual darkness is a problem today
- People are <u>blind</u> to the <u>truth about God</u> <u>blind</u> to the <u>truth</u> in the Bible <u>blind</u> to God's <u>rules</u> and <u>blind</u> to the <u>truth</u> about why God's sent His Son
 Jesus
- And this is because as the Apostle Paul says in 2 Cor 4:4 Satan has blinded the minds of unbelievers, so that they cannot see the light of God

The Light of the World Promised (Isaiah 42:1-9)

- In our OT reading from Isaiah 42:1-9 [Which you can turn to now]
- God promises a solution to this spiritual darkness
- God promises a Light to combat this spiritual darkness

[PowerPoint 3-Servant]

- See V1 God through Isaiah promises His Servant
- He will be filled with God's Spirit
- He will be God's Chosen One
- And this of course points to none other than Jesus
- God's Messiah The Christ
- And Jesus the Servant, will bring justice to the whole world not just to the Jewish people - but non-Jews - Gentiles as well
- V2 He will not shout or cry out this doesn't mean Jesus won't speak
 loudly but it refers to His gentleness Jesus didn't make His way by
 bluster and being loud and shouting people down into submission but He
 taught with an amazing spirit filled authority and by example
- V3 A bruised reed He will not break and smoldering wick he will not snuff out This is another reference to Jesus' gentle character. A reed is a fragile plant yet if a reed is bruised Jesus the Servant will handle it so gently that He will not break it. And if a wick is smoldering it just has smoke coming out of it Jesus the servant will gently blow the smoking wick until it fans into a flame again. The idea is that Jesus deals with people ever so gently and tenderly helping people along until the bruised reed is strong and the smoldering wick is a full flame
- Just because someone might appear broken and beyond repair to <u>us</u> doesn't mean they <u>are</u> broken and beyond repair <u>for</u> Jesus to fix
 (pause)

- Jesus wants us to have <u>His</u> heart towards the lowly, the broken and the hurting it's easy to pass people like <u>that</u> by <u>like</u> the priest on the road to Jericho passed by the man who had been robbed and beaten (Luke 10)
- Still v3 This Servant Jesus will be faithful to His mission and bring about true justice - without faltering or being discouraged
- V4 This justice will be throughout the whole Earth not just Israel -
- People everywhere have the opportunity to put their hope in Him

How will this happen?

[PowerPoint 4-Light]

- See V6 God will make this servant Jesus a covenant a new agreement
 with people Jesus will be a shining light not just to Israel but to the
 Gentiles
- And His job will be to open the eyes of those who are spiritually blind
- He will bring people out of the prison and dark dungeon of their sinful lives
- And bring them into His glorious light so they can see God's truth
- How can the people of Isaiah's day be sure this will happen?
- See V8
- Because God is the Lord YHWH by His Holy Name it has to happen
 as He promises because He is the one true God and the only one full
 of glory and who always keeps His promises
- And because V9 All those things He promised in the past have happened
 so we can be sure future things He promises will take place too

Which brings us to our NT reading from Luke 2:22-40 [Please turn there now]

And the fulfilment of the promise that God made through Isaiah

The Light of the World Comes (Luke 2:22-40)

- Jesus this Promised Servant has been born of a virgin- Mary through the power of the HS as we learnt on Christmas Day
- And we pick up the story where Jesus' earthly parents Mary and Joseph
 - follow the purification rules of the OT law and take the baby to the Temple

[PowerPoint 5-Temple]

- Lev 12 says a woman who gives birth to a baby is ceremonially unclean for 7 days (like she is during her monthly period)
- Then on 8th day a baby boy born must be circumcised as per v21
- Then the woman must wait 33 days to be purified from her bleeding (Lev 12:4)
- After this purification time (33 days) see v22 of Luke 2
- The woman must make a sacrifice at the temple of a lamb and a young
 pigeon or dove
- If she can't afford a lamb she is to bring 2 doves or 2 young pigeons
- Mary and Joseph v24 brought a pair of pigeons or doves showing
 that they were not rich at all and that Jesus had been born into a poor
 and humble home not a palace fit for a king showing Jesus is available
 to everyone
- Just because Mary and Joseph were the earthly parents of the Son of God -doesn't mean God's Law doesn't apply to them

[PowerPoint 6-Simeon]

- When they were at the temple they came across a righteous and devout
 man named Simeon v25
- He was waiting for the consolation of Israel meaning he was waiting for a time when Israel would be comforted or encouraged - means waiting for the promised Messiah
- He had the HS spirit with Him and v26 the HS promised Simeon he
 would not die before He saw the Messiah
- This promised Servant God's Chosen One the one promised back in
 Isaiah 600 years earlier is finally here
- So, with the help of the HS v27 Simeon happened to be in the temple at the same time as Mary and Joseph and the baby
- And v28 Simeon took that baby in his arms
- V29 Simeon confirms God's promise has been fulfilled and Simeon can
 now die in peace
- Because V30 He has seen God's salvation in his arms he is actually
 holding the salvation of the world
- Simeon goes onto to say v32 This baby will not only be Saviour for Israel but a light to the non-Jews the Gentiles
- This baby will enable people to come out of the spiritual darkness of their sin - and into His glorious light
- This baby will enable people to have their sins forgiven and be reconciled
 to God
- Simeon goes on to say in v34
- This child is destined to cause the falling and rising of many in Israel

- This will be shown later in the way that men like Peter and Paul
 repented and men like Judas betrayed. And in the way that one thief
 next to Jesus on the cross blasphemed and the other thief next to
 Jesus on the cross believed. Jesus is like a magnet that is attractive to
 some but others are repelled from Him
- And that's still the same today some people accept Jesus others
 reject Him
- Still v34 Jesus will be a sign spoken against basically a target that
 people shoot at. That happened in Jesus' life on Earth he was the target
 for the Scribes and Pharisees and the Romans and He is still a target
 for people to shoot at today
- And because He is a target open for criticism and rejection as well as
 acceptance Jesus also exposes peoples' true colours He reveals what's
 in people's hearts and in their thoughts v35
- His rejection in His lifetime will also cause a sword to pierce his own
 mother's soul v35. It was important for Mary to know that mothering
 the Messiah would not all be sweetness and light. It was both a great
 privilege and a great burden for her.
- There was someone else in the temple that day

[PowerPoint 7-Anna]

- Anna a prophet a widow V37
- She was a woman of worship and prayer and never left the temple such
 a close walk with God
- She also came up to Mary and Joseph that day v38
- And she spoke about how **Jesus** would **redeem** God's **people**Page 8 of 11

- Redeem mays to buy back something
- Jesus will grow up to buy people back to God
- To buy back something back costs something
- It costs Jesus His life on a cross He took sin off us and put it on Himself
- And gave us a new life of forgiveness and then through his resurrection
 a gift of eternal life
- If we should choose to accept this gift

The bottom line is, Jesus is the Light of the World

[PowerPoint 8-Darkness to Light]

who enables people to come out of the darkness of sin - into the Light of God.

How will we respond to the Light of the World?

[PowerPoint 9-Heading]

Our Response to the Light of the World

1. First, we must believe that Jesus is the Light of the World - & come & walk in His Light all the days of our life and keep away from the darkness of sin.

[PowerPoint 9a-Believe]

As the Apostle John says in John 1:5-6 ⁵ This is the message we have heard from him and declare to you: God is light; in him there is no darkness at all. ⁶ If we claim to have fellowship with him and yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not live out the truth. (1 John 1:5-6)

Second, we must understand - as the Apostle Paul reminds us in Ephesians
 that we were once in darkness but now we are in the Light of the Lord and we must live as children of light.

[PowerPoint 9b-children of light]

And Jesus defines what it means to be children of light - in Matthew 5:1416: ¹⁴ "You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. ¹⁵ Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. ¹⁶ In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven.

What will it look like for us to be lights of the world?

It will look like: doing to others what you would have them do to you (Matt 7:12 – Golden rule)

- Would you like to be left in the darkness of your sin? Then don't leave others in the darkness of their sin?
- Do you like it when people get in your face and try to tell you what to believe? If you don't - then don't do it to others. Be gentle in how you share Jesus with them?
- Do you appreciate it when people say one thing and do the complete opposite and act like a hypocrite? Then you don't do it.
- Do you like it when someone is kind to you? Then you be kind?
- If you were hungry, how would you want someone to treat you?
- If you want to be fed, then feed others.
- If you appreciate being loved, then love others.
- If you appreciate being helped, then help others.

As Jesus says whatever you do to the least - you do it for me (Matt 25:40) Friends, let us imitate Jesus - the Light of the World - and bring His light of love to our community
