We'll be going through 1 Corinthians chapter 15 in some detail.

Let me **pray** before we begin...

So, throughout the month of January - we're doing a series on "SHUN" words in the Bible - that's words in the Bible that end in "TION" - SHUN

[PowerPoint 1-SHUN]

In **January 2019** - we looked at:

Revelation, Substitution, Salvation, Redemption

Now in January 2020 we'll be looking at a few more SHUN words:

Propitiation, Justification, Adoption (last week), and Resurrection

So, we'd better define resurrection:

[PowerPoint 2-Defintion]

Restoring a dead person back to life

There's a movie that came out in 2017 - called *The Case for Christ*It's a true story of an investigative journalist - Lee Strobel - whose wife Leslie becomes a Christian.

This really rocks Lee's world and he sets out to disprove Christianity

Let's have a brief look

[PowerPoint 3-Play video]

So, if Lee can disprove the resurrection of Jesus - as one of his work colleagues says - if you disprove that - Christianity will collapse like a house of cards.

Lee could have saved himself a lot of trouble if he'd just read and believed our chapter from 1 Corinthians 15

The Apostle Paul does his own investigation and his argument goes like this

First, I'll prove the resurrection of Jesus is true - that's in verses 1 to 11 
then I'll prove the resurrection of believers is true.

# Resurrection of Jesus is True (vv1-11)

#### [PowerPoint 4-Heading]

- Paul reminds the Corinthians of the Gospel he preached to them
- The Gospel = the Good News of Jesus
- V2 This Gospel saved them
- How?

## [PowerPoint 4a-Gospel]

- V3 Because Jesus died so that people who believe in Him don't get
   punished for their sins He takes the punishment instead
- Jesus didn't just die for a political cause or as an enemy of the state but He died for our sins.
- After He died He was buried (as predicted by the prophet Isaiah 53:9) and He rose from the dead (resurrected) on 3<sup>rd</sup> day after His death and

this was also according to scriptures (v4) - what scriptures (Matt 16:21; 17:23; 20:19 and Hosea 6:2; Jonah 1:17; Psalm 16:10)?

- The cross of Jesus is the payment for our sins to be forgiven
- The empty tomb and His resurrection are the receipt for that payment showing that the perfect Son of God made the perfect payment for our
  sins

How can Paul be sure this happened?

Well like any true story in history - there has to be **eye witnesses**[PowerPoint 4b-witnesses]

And there are many!

The resurrected Jesus:

- Appeared to Cephas (Peter) in Luke 24:34 and to the Apostles (Mark 16:14; Luke 24:36-43 and John 20:19-25 (v5)
- Then He appeared to more than 500 people (Matt 28:10; 28:16-17; Acts 1:15 most still living when Paul wrote this letter to the Corinthians so it can be verified. That's a lot of eye witnesses how many witnesses would we want to believe? 500 is a whole school full (v6)
- Then Jesus appeared to James and other apostles (v7) and then to Paul himself (v8)
- Then Paul adds weight to his argument v9 that why would someone like
  him who persecuted Christians say it was true unless it was. It was the
  appearance of Christ to Paul that convinced Paul about the truth of
  Jesus

The testimony of these witnesses is overwhelming

Not only did they see Jesus after His death - but they saw Him in a manner that revolutionized their faith and trust in Him

#### [PowerPoint 4c-change in disciples]

The changed character of the apostles - they went from scared wimps to brave martyrs willing to die for Jesus - after seeing Jesus resurrected

So - with that amount of evidence - Paul says

The resurrection of Jesus is true!

### Resurrection of Believers is True (vv12-34)

Why did Paul so carefully prove the truth of the resurrection of Jesus?

It wasn't because the Corinthians didn't believe Jesus rose from the dead. In fact, Paul says they believed it at the end of v11

The Corinthians didn't deny Jesus resurrection - they <u>denied</u> theirs and <u>our</u> resurrection - they denied that believers are raised

Perhaps the Corinthians were influenced by Greek Philosophy which considered resurrection undesirable, thinking that a state of 'pure spirit' would be superior or they were influenced by the thinking of religious groups, like the Sadducees, who thought the idea of the resurrection was wishful thinking

Therefore, Paul argues, the resurrection of Believers is true in vv12-34

[PowerPoint 5-Heading]

Paul asks the question v12 - if it is preached that Jesus' resurrection is
true and you believe it - how come people are saying the resurrection of
the dead is not true?

- Paul shows how the resurrection of Jesus not only proves His own resurrection but it proves the general principle of resurrection
- Paul's logic goes like this

### [PowerPoint 5a-logic]

- o If there's no principle of resurrection, then Jesus did not rise from the dead
- If Jesus did not rise from the dead then death had power over
   Him and defeated Him
- o If death has power over Jesus He is not God
- If Jesus is not God He's not perfect and He cannot offer a complete sacrifice for sins, and our sins are not completely paid for by God
- If my sins are not completely paid for by God then I'm still in my sins
- o Therefore, if Jesus is not risen He is unable to save anyone
- And v17 if Christ is not risen our faith is futile our faith is as
   useful as a chocolate teapot
- And also, in v18 if Jesus has not been raised then those believers
   who have already died are lost and gone forever
- And v19 if there is no resurrection then the whole Christian life
   is a pitiful joke
- Paul goes on to say in v20 that Jesus is the firstfruits of resurrection
   [PowerPoint 5b-firstfruits]
  - What Paul is saying is that Jesus' resurrection anticipates our resurrection

- As in the case when the Jews offered God the firstfruits of their harvest they were assured of God's blessing on the whole harvest so by the resurrection of Jesus as the firstfruits of resurrection the blessing of our resurrection is assured that's Paul's argument
- [The festival of firstfruits in OT was on the day after Sabbath following Passover (Lev 23:9-14). Significantly Jesus rose from the dead on the exact day of the Feast of Firstfruits - the day after the Sabbath following Passover]
- o It's like **Jesus** is our **entrance fee** to resurrection
- Paul goes on to say what Jesus' resurrection achieves
   [PowerPoint 5c-Adam & Jesus]
- As death came from one man (Adam) who sinned v21 resurrection of the dead comes through one man (Jesus=2<sup>nd</sup> Adam) -
- So v22 even though all die because of Adam Paul says all <u>in Christ</u> will be made alive through Jesus [John 5:29 - states all people are resurrected - believers to eternal life - and non-believers to eternal damnation]
- And so V23 Jesus is the first to be raised from the dead and then
  when He returns all those who belong to him (those who believe in Him)
  will be raised to life too
- And when Jesus does return in v24 then the end will come
- Jesus' resurrection sets in motion a chain of events which lead to
   Jesus reigning until he has put all His enemies under his feet and the
   last enemy Jesus has to destroy is death v26

- Then Paul throws in more reasons to believe the resurrection of the dead is true in verses 29 to 32
- He says in v29 there was a strange practice of baptizing people on behalf of those who have already died. It seems like this might have been a superstitious custom - Paul's not necessarily approving of this custom
- But his argument is what is the point in baptising people on behalf of those who have already died - if there is no life beyond death?

#### [PowerPoint 5d-Why suffer?]

- Another reason to support the resurrection of the dead v30 If there
  is no resurrection why would Paul place his life in jeopardy for the
  Gospel?
- Paul lived life on the edge for Jesus and the Gospel as he says in v31 he faced death every day why would he face death daily for
  something that's not true?
- As he says v32 did I face wild beasts in Ephesus for nothing?

## [PowerPoint 5e-No Judgement]

- And his next argument is compelling. If there is no resurrection then
  there's also no future judgment to be concerned about so he can do
  what he likes eat and drink and party for tomorrow he dies.
- That's the way a lot of people live today they say we only live once so let's do whatever makes us happy before we die and it's all over
- But Paul says no, no, no!

- V33 don't be misled bad company corrupts good character
- Where did the Corinthians get their strange idea about the resurrection from?
- They got the idea from hanging around with bad company like the
   Sadducees who don't believe in the resurrection and by associating
   with pagan, Greek philosophy types who didn't believe in the
   resurrection (Acts 17:31-32)
- Paul's saying no don't conform to the pattern of the world (Rom 12:1) v34 come back to your senses and stop sinning like this don't be
   ignorant about things of God

So, Paul has explained that the resurrection of Jesus is true

And that the resurrection of believers is true

Finally, he tackles the question - what resurrection looks like - in vv35-v57

## What Resurrection looks like (vv35-57)

[PowerPoint 6-Heading]

That's the question raised in v35 by some people in Corinth

How are the dead raised? With what kind of body will they come?

To explain what the nature of resurrected body looks like

## [PowerPoint 6a-Seed]

Paul uses the analogy of a seed in vv35-38

Paul says our bodies are like "seeds" which "grow" into resurrection bodies.

When you bury the body of a believer, you are "sowing" a "seed" that will come out of the earth as a resurrection body.

#### Charles Spurgeon puts it this way:

"If death is like a sowing a seed, let us do away with all faithless, hopeless, graceless sorrow... 'Our family circle has been broken,' say you. Yes, but only broken that it may be re-formed. You have lost a dear friend: yes, but only lost that friend that you may find him again, and find more than you lost. They are not lost; they are sown."

(pause)

When you plant a wheat seed, a big wheat seed doesn't come up. Instead, a stalk of wheat grows. So, even though our resurrection bodies come from our present bodies, we should not expect that they will be the same bodies or just "improved" bodies. They will be transformed bodies.

## [PowerPoint 6b-Heavenly body]

Then Paul uses the analogy of living and heavenly bodies - v39-41

Paul says all flesh is not the same. There are different kinds of bodies (flesh) in God's creation - people, animals, birds, fish. And there are heavenly bodies. Our resurrection body will be a heavenly body, suited for life in heaven, not only for life on this earth.

There are different bodies or structures in the universe - sun, moon and stars - and each is created with its own glory and each is suited to its own particular environment and needs. While our present bodies are adapted for

the environment of time and earth, our resurrection bodies will be adapted for the environment of eternity and heaven.

It's hard for us to understand what our resurrected bodies will be like so Paul uses a contrast to help us - in vv42-44 - giving four contrasts between our present body and future resurrection body.

On all counts, the resurrected body wins

#### [PowerPoint 6c-contrasts]

- Imperishable triumphs over perishable
- Glory triumphs over dishonour
- Power triumphs over weakness
- Spiritual triumphs over physical

## Then Paul describes two Adams and their two bodies in vv45-49

## [PowerPoint 6d-2 Adams]

First Adam - living being - from dust - we have image of earthly man Second Adam (Jesus) - live giving-spirit - from Heaven - then we have image of the Heavenly man - when Jesus rose - He could eat [Luke 24:39-43) yet not bound by laws of nature - he vanished out of sight (Luke 24:31) - appeared in the midst of the disciples (Luke 24:36-37)

## [PowerPoint 6e-imperishable]

Then Paul describes the need for a resurrected body - in vv50-53

Flesh and blood = our current bodies can't inherit kingdom of God - so we
 need a resurrected body

- He argues our current perishable bodies can't inherit the
  imperishable life of Heaven our current bodies which are subject to
  disease, sickness, injury and one day decay are unsuitable for
  heaven.
- Paul also reveals a mystery something the Corinthians couldn't know by reason or research but something God has revealed to Paul
- He says not all Christians will die, but there will be a "final generation" still alive when Jesus returns this final generation will be transformed
  into resurrection bodies at the return of Jesus before they ever face
  death.
- In s single moment, Jesus will gather His people (those already dead and those alive on Earth) He will gather them to Himself for resurrection.
- This event is known as the **rapture** (1 Thes 4)
- At this rapture the last trumpet will sound v52
- And v53 and so the perishable body will put on the imperishable body
  - the mortal body will become immortal

In light of all of this - Paul's arguing - how could the Corinthians let go of such an important truth?

The bottom line is resurrection is the final defeat of death - vv54-57

When the resurrection happens - the sting of death is defeated

The principle of resurrection proves that we are not subject to the penalty of the law (which is death for sinners), - and instead we are set free from

sin. The resurrection defeats this penalty of sin - and removes the sting of death.

All this is possible - <u>only</u> because God sent Jesus - so Paul concludes his argument in v57 by giving thanks <u>to</u> God <u>for</u> Jesus

So, we've seen that the resurrection of Jesus is true
We've seen the resurrection of believers is true
We've seen what resurrection looks like

#### Conclusion (and Response) - V58

What should our response be to all this?

## [PowerPoint 7-Heading]

I mentioned the movie - The Case for Christ - at the beginning

Without spoiling the movie too much - I hope

In his investigation - Lee could <u>not</u> disprove the resurrection of Jesus - so he was left with no option - but to believe it.

Paul gives the Corinthians - and us - no option but to believe it - because it's true

And Paul gives us a threefold response in the final verse - v58

## [PowerPoint 7a-Stand firm]

1. 1<sup>st</sup> - To stand firm - people will try to shake our faith in the resurrection - and make us doubt - but Paul's given us more than enough evidence to show clearly our hope of being resurrected in the future is a certain hope. So, stand firm - keep away from bad company - and don't be led away into sin.

## [PowerPoint 7b-Let nothing move you]

2. 2<sup>nd</sup> - let nothing move you - Because we know we will be resurrected to new life, we can endure persecution and danger for Christ's sake (verses 30-32), just as our Lord Jesus did - just as Paul did. Because of the resurrection of Jesus Christ, thousands of <u>Christian martyrs</u> through history have willingly traded their earthly lives for everlasting life and the promise of resurrection - so let nothing move you from this faith

#### [PowerPoint 7c-work]

3. 3<sup>rd</sup> - Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord - because you know that your labor for the Lord is not in vain. Part of that work for the Lord means to help people who are ignorant about God - and are lost from God. Helping people who are lost from God - will never be work that is in vain.
