There's no I in Team (Ecclesiastes 4:9-12 & 1 Cor 3:1-23) 23-Feb-20

We'll be looking at 1 Corinthians chapter 3

INTRO

I have a dream

That our whole community comes to believe in Jesus

I have a dream

That everyone I know (friends and family) comes to believe in Jesus

Actually - it's not just my dream

According to Acts 17:30 it says - in the past <u>God</u> overlooked the ignorance of not believing - but now <u>He</u> commands all people to repent

You see - God is patient not wanting anyone to perish but everyone to come to repentance (2 Peter 3:9)

God wants everyone to repent of their sins and be saved for Heaven However, people have choices whether they repent or not

God has given us the church - not the building - but the people who believe - to achieve His mission to bring people into repentance and into a relationship with Jesus

But the church has to be a team

Team work makes the dream work

Wouldn't it be great if <u>everyone</u> here at St. David's was in a growth group - studying God's Word together - and being equipped to be a team of believers enabling more and more people to follow Jesus

Wouldn't it be great if more people came and joined the team so we could reach the community with the Good News of Jesus?

Wouldn't it be great if we had too many Scripture teachers - so we had cover for when teachers are sick or away on holiday

Team work makes the dream work

But the **Team** has to be properly **unified** and the Team has to **realise who** is **in control** of this team -

God is in control of His team

Speaking of making the dream work

Let's watch this video...

[PowerPoint 1 - Show Video of Orchestra]

An Orchestra is a good metaphor for God's Team

A metaphor is:

[PowerPoint 2-Metaphor]

a figure of speech in which a word or phrase is applied to an object or action to which it is not literally applicable.

e.g. William Shakespeare uses the metaphor: The **World is a stage** and all **men and women** are merely **players** on this stage

An Orchestra is a great metaphor for God's Team

Each person in the orchestra has a part to play

Without the **conductor** of the orchestra, though - they can't play together properly

In God's Team - God's orchestra - God is the conductor

The Church of God in Corinth - had problems in their team

Problems in the Team of Corinth (1 Cor 3:1-4)

- The Corinthians are <u>not</u> living by the Spirit <u>but</u> worldly (v1)
 - As Christians they have the Holy Spirit inside them <u>but</u> they are <u>not living life in step</u> with the HS they are <u>not showing</u> the <u>fruit</u> of the <u>spirit</u> <u>but</u> are <u>still</u> following the way of the world
- Paul says the Corinthians are immature -it's like they are on baby food
 and not solids - in other words they're not growing spiritually (v2)
 - o I'm grateful to Jenny Carson for an illustration she shared at B/S this week -we can feed ourselves up on junk food - like Maccas or KFC on the way home - and then we can't eat the lovely roast dinner we have waiting for us at home - because we're full up on junk food
 - o In the same way we can fill ourselves up with the junk of the world's wisdom and the world's way and then have no room for God's Word in our lives and in our hearts and we remain immature Christians
 - A mature Christian means we go from believing Jesus is my Saviour
 to believing Jesus is my Saviour and Lord of my life
- Also, Paul says, the Corinthians are jealous and quarrelsome (v3) and that's a human characteristic not a spiritual one. Remember as Christians the fruit of the spirit is love, joy, peace, patient, kindness, goodness, faithfulness and self-control. There's no mention of jealousy or quarrelling in the fruit of the spirit
- You see the reason there is jealousy and quarrelling in Corinth is (v4) because the Corinthians are following church leaders like Paul and
 Apollos instead of following the Lord God. They've set their favourite

leader up as a king - just like the Israelites wanted a king <u>like</u> the other nations - the Corinthians want a leader like the "world" wants.

 Living the world's way - leaves God (and His Son - and His Spirit) out of the equation

So, the bottom line is - the church folk in Corinth - are still following the pattern of the world - and not focusing on Jesus - and spiritual/heavenly things

So, Paul describes what **God's Team** - the church - should look like - that's in vv5-21

God's Team:

1st God's team must have **leaders working** as a **Team** <u>under</u> **God**- that's in vv1-5
[PowerPoint 4a-Team under God]

- 1. Must have leaders working as a team under God (vv5-9)
 - In vv1-5 Paul uses the metaphor of a garden or a farm
 - Apollos and Paul are mere servants (diakonos = minister = <u>servant</u>) <u>not</u>
 bosses v5
 - Apollos and Paul are instruments sent by God through whom the
 Corinthians came to believe v5
 - Paul planted the seed of the Gospel v6 He was the church planter
 - Apollos watered the seed v6
 - Paul and Apollos are <u>aren't</u> anything special only God is special because
 he makes the seed of the Gospel grow v7
 - Paul has one purpose to plant a seed v8 he will be rewarded for that
 - Apollos has one purpose to water v8 he will be rewarded for that Page 4 of 11

- But they are both co-workers serving the MASTER who is God they are not masters just God's servants/workers v9
- They are God's field literally God's farm
- GOD IS THE ONE WHO GROWS HIS CHURCH NOT LEADERS LEADERS ARE SERVANTS AND GOD'S INSTRUMENTS AND SHOULD
 BE A TEAM NOT THINKING GROWTH RELIES ON THE LEADER OR
 THEIR STRENGTH
- Application our church has had continuous ministry for 67 years now
 - o There have been many leaders come through
 - o They have planted and watered and replanted and re-watered
 - No one leader is better than the next they <u>all</u> served remembering God is the Master and the Grower
- Application In our church today we have various leaders: elders,
 preachers, youth leaders, music leaders, growth group leaders and
 different ministry leaders (you can read about them all in our ACM
 reports)
- No one leader in our church family is better than another they all work together in God's Team realizing progress is dependent on God
- Application are we putting certain leaders in our church on a pedestal & having them in competition with other leaders and quarrelling about it?
- Application are we a team player or individualistic?

2. Built on the Foundation of Jesus (vv10-15)

2nd point - **God's team** is **built** on the **foundation** of **Jesus Christ** - that's in verses 10 to 15 - Paul uses a **building metaphor** this time

[PowerPoint 4b-Foundation]

- God's grace allowed Paul to be the one to lay a foundation of the Corinth church like a wise builder v10 in other words it was a huge privilege
 for Paul to be the one to plant the church
- Someone else builds on this foundation but Paul says anyone building on this foundation must do it with care v10
- The foundation that was laid was Jesus Christ -
- Jesus is the cornerstone or foundational stone of the Church. In building terms - the cornerstone is laid first - and everything is built and measured from that cornerstone
- We <u>can't</u> build a church on any other foundation than Jesus otherwise there will be confusion about who we are serving - v11
 - For example a church <u>can't</u> be built on a leader who is charismatic and charming or a huge personality people will start following that leader and not Jesus [we can certainly admire a charismatic leader but remember it's Jesus we're following]
- Paul goes on to say v12 some things that are built on top of the church's foundation of Jesus - might be more precious - or better quality than other things
 - Precious/top quality building materials are like gold, silver, costly stones
 - Other less precious or lower quality materials are like wood, hay,
 straw
 - So, Paul's point is there are two types of things built on top of the foundation of Jesus

- Permanent, imperishable, lasting things
- Or temporary, perishable or short-lived things
- For example, in our church we could have ministries that clearly proclaim and reinforce the Gospel - the Good News of Jesus [like Growth Groups and Jaffa]
- And they're might be other ministries which appear more like
 social ministries [like Movies on Saturday Art/Craft]
- Paul says whatever ministries we build on the foundation of Jesus will be judged and evaluated when Jesus returns - v13 - to see if we were wise builders or not
- All our efforts will be put through a fire to burn off any
 impurities and to test the quality of that work for the Lord v13
- If the work survives the quality control test the builder will receive a reward - v14
- If the work burns up the builder will suffer a loss but will still be saved - but scorched by the flames
- WE NEED TO BE WISE WHEN WE BUILD OUR CHURCH (NOT BUILDING) - IT NEEDS TO BE BUILT ON JESUS' FOUNDATION -CHRIST CENTRED - AND THINGS WE BUILD SHOULD BE JESUS FOCUSED - SO THEY MAKE DISCIPLES AND GROW DISCIPLES
- Application it's worth us taking a self-evaluation
 - Are the ministries we're running here at St. David's focusing on the love of Jesus - and inviting people to come to Jesus as their Lord and Saviour - or are they just social ministries. How can we change a particular ministry to be more Christ Centred?

• Application - are we involved in a ministry for the right reason? - is it to tickle our ego? - or to share the Good News of Jesus - and make and grow disciples of Jesus?

3. <u>God's Team is the Church - which is the Temple of God (vv16-17)</u> 3rd point - God's Team is the church which is God's temple - vv16 to 17 [PowerPoint 4c-Temple]

- Paul says v16 collectively the people of the church are God's temple because God's Spirit lives in its midst v16
- It stands to reason that if the Holy Spirit lives inside each Christian then as Christians gather together God's Spirit will be amongst them
- Paul's telling us the church is the temple of God for a good reason
- See v17 he issues a serious warning if someone messes with God's
 temple they will bring trouble on themselves God's temple is sacred and together the people of the church are God's temple
- To stress how important God's temple is Paul mentions temple 4 times in these 2 verses (16 &17)
- Remember Jesus built the church on the confession of faith of the
 Apostle Peter that Jesus is the Messiah the Son of God Matt 16:16
- And Jesus promised to build His church on the faith of His believers
- And Jesus died for His church so people would believe in Him be forgiven and have eternal life
- So, Paul says <u>don't</u> mess with God's church His temple because you're messing with people's salvation - <u>don't</u> mess with God's church - or you Page 8 of 11

will be destroyed - Remember persecuting God's church is persecuting Jesus (Acts 9:4)

Our Response (vv18-21)

How should we respond then - as members of God's team

[PowerPoint 5a-Response 1]

First response - we need to realize that we don't know everything

- Paul says v18 we should become "fools" and admit we don't know everything and that maybe there is a higher wisdom from God through His Spirit -which we learnt about last week
- Oliver Crowell sent this message to the Scots: I beseech thee from the bowels of Christ, think it possible that you may be mistaken
- We should not think we know it all and realize only God knows all
- In the world's wisdom many people think they don't need God they can
 figure everything out on their own and they see God is just a crutch
 for the weak
- But Paul says v19 when we compare the world's wisdom with God's wisdom there's no comparison v19 the world's wisdom is foolish in God's sight
- The world outsmarts itself because it thinks it's wiser than it is v20

Second response - Paul says v21 - we must <u>not</u> boast in human leaders (or ourselves for that matter) - we can't serve two masters - instead boast in Jesus!

[PowerPoint 5b-Response 2]

- Why shouldn't we boast in human leaders? Because...
- Human leaders are fallible, temporary and sinful
- Whereas Jesus is heavenly infallible, permanent and sinless
 There's no comparison

Conclusion (v22-v23)

- To finish up then
- Paul argues in v22-23

[PowerPoint 6a-All]

- Why boast about a human leader or yourself when you can boast about Jesus the king & master of the universe and be part of team God
- V22 all is ours Paul says because v23 we are of Christ and Christ is
 of God so we are on team God
- What does it mean to have all because we are of Christ? v22
 - It means we have the forgiveness of our sins past, present and future
 - o We have His strength (not our own) for the present and future
 - We have the certain secure hope for the future with eternal life
 in Heaven guaranteed

We have everything by being on God's Team - through the Work of Jesus - so why would we follow something inferior when we have the best?

I began with my dream - that the whole community comes to believe in Jesus - and that everyone I know comes to believe in Jesus - and that everyone at St.

David's would be in a Growth Group becoming equipped to make disciples of Jesus - and that the number of Scripture teachers would overflow - Page 10 of 11

That dream is possible in God's Team - if we remember

- Jesus is the foundation of the team
- That the whole purpose of the Team is to promote Jesus

[PowerPoint 6b-John 3:30]

- And if we do as John the Baptist said when Jesus arrived on the scene
- John the Baptist said in John 3:30 He [JESUS] must become greater - I [Paul, each person in St. David's] must become less (pause)

There's no I in TEAM

[PowerPoint 7-No I in Team]

Let's pray...
