He is not here. He is Risen

(Gen 3:15, Num 21:9, Deut 18:15, Luke 24:1-35)

Easter Sunday - 12-Apr-20

We'll be looking at the NT passage from Luke 24 and the OT passages from Gen 3:15, Num 21:9 and Deut 18:15

Let's pray and ask for God's help in understanding His Word.

INTRO

On Good Friday we said the greatest words ever spoken were Jesus' words on the Cross when he said "It is Finished" (John 19:30)

And we said Jesus finished His job of saving people lost from God - and He died on a cruel cross to take the punishment for sin - and offer forgiveness for sins - for those who care to believe in Him.

And we **left** Jesus in a **tomb**.

[PowerPoint 1-Words of Good Friday/Easter Sunday]

Now here we are 3 days later - and <u>arguably</u> equally as important are the words from Luke 24:5-6 - when the angels at the tomb said to the women who have come to anoint Jesus' body

"Why do you look for the living among the dead? ⁶ He is not here; he has risen! Remember how he told you, while he was still with you in Galilee:

You see when the women arrived at the tomb the huge stone across the entrance of the tomb had been rolled away (v2) - and Jesus' body was not there

Now various theories have been put forward about the resurrection

- There's the wrong tomb theory but the women knew the exact tomb (Luke 23:55)
- There's the wishful thinking theory that Jesus' followers just wished
 He was alive but when we hear of the surprise of the women (v4) when
 Jesus' body is not in the tomb and when we hear of the surprise of the
 disciples when the women told them (v11) we can dismiss that theory
- Then there's the theory that Jesus wasn't dead that he feigned his death but no one could have survived a Roman crucifixion, especially after he was scourged first. Also, the Romans had strict procedures a Roman soldier was given the death penalty if a prisoner did not die or escaped. Also, Jesus was already dead before they broke his legs. Blood and water coming from Jesus when His side was pierced show that Jesus' lungs had collapsed and he had died from asphyxiation.
- Then there's the stolen body theory which is answered by the Romans guards and the huge stone guarding the entrance (Matt 27:62-66).

Eye Witnesses to the Risen Jesus

So, we're left with only one possibility - that Jesus' resurrection is true

How do we know when any event is true?

Eye witnesses?

[PowerPoint 2-Eye Witness]

From Acts 1 - we have the evidence that the Risen Jesus appeared on many

occasions for over 40 days

And from 1 Cor 15 - we read that there were over 500 eye witnesses of the

risen Jesus - plus Jesus appeared to **James**, all the **Apostles** and also to the

Apostle Paul (v5-8)

There's no way all these witnesses could have colluded or all hallucinated

Why we can believe Jesus is Risen

Should we be surprised by the resurrection?

[PowerPoint 3-Why we can believe]

Not at all - Jesus said so!

On three occasions in Mark's Gospel - that He would be killed and rise again

three days later.

In Mark 8:31-38

³¹ He then began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many

things and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests and the teachers of

the law, and that he must be killed and after three days rise again. ³² He

spoke plainly about this, and Peter took him aside and began to rebuke

him.

Then Mark 9:30-32

³⁰ They left that place and passed through Galilee. Jesus did not want anyone to know where they were, ³¹ because he was teaching his disciples. He said to them, "The Son of Man is going to be delivered into the hands of men. They will kill him, and after three days he will rise."

³² But they did not understand what he meant and were afraid to ask him about it.

And also, in Mark 10:32-34

They were on their way up to Jerusalem, with Jesus leading the way, and the disciples were astonished, while those who followed were afraid. Again, he took the Twelve aside and told them what was going to happen to him. ³³ "We are going up to Jerusalem," he said, "and the Son of Man will be delivered over to the chief priests and the teachers of the law. They will condemn him to death and will hand him over to the Gentiles, ³⁴ who will mock him and spit on him, flog him and kill him. Three days later he will rise."

We can also believe the resurrection because of what the **risen Jesus** said in our NT passage from **Luke 24** to the **two men** on the road to **Emmaus**See verses 25-27:

²⁵ He said to them, "How foolish you are, and how slow to believe all that the prophets have spoken! ²⁶ Did not the Messiah have to suffer these things and then enter his glory?" ²⁷ And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he explained to them what was said in all the Scriptures concerning himself.

You see the whole Bible points to Jesus' Rescue Mission

[PowerPoint 4-Scripture]

Right back at the first book - Genesis

One of our OT readings - Gen 3:15 - God spoke to the snake & said:

And I will put enmity

between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers;

he will crush your head, and you will strike his heel."

When God spoke to the Snake - other parts of the Bible making it clear that the snake is Satan - and that the snake is a personification of sin and rebellion against God.

So, God said He would put enmity (hostility) between the Snake and the Woman (Eve) and between the Snake's offspring (Satan) and the woman's offspring (Jesus)

And the woman's offspring (Jesus) will crush Satan's head - and Satan will strike Jesus' heel

The heel is the part of a human within the snake's reach. When Jesus took on human form - He brought Himself near to Satan's reach so Satan could strike Him

So right back when sin and death entered the world

God already forecast a spiritual war <u>between</u> good and evil - <u>between</u> Jesus and Satan

And God made the promise right there - that Jesus would crush Satan's power.

Yes! - Satan struck Jesus' heel - by Jesus being crucified - but that was all part of God's plan anyway. But Jesus crushed Satan's head - because He defeated the two things Satan brought into this world - sin and death. Jesus defeated the punishment of sin on the cross on Good Friday - and He defeated the power of death - by rising again on Easter Sunday

As we look at our other OT readings

In Numbers 21:9 - Moses made a bronze snake and put it on a pole - and when any of the Israelites that were bitten by the snake God sent - because of their rebellion against Him - looked at the bronze snake on the pole - they lived

Jesus identified Himself with that bronze snake being lifted up in John 3:14-15 - when He said:

¹⁴Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the wilderness, so the Son of Man must be lifted up, ¹⁵that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him."

What we have here is a picture of the snake as the personification of sin and rebellion - made of bronze - a metal associated with judgment, since it is made with fire. So, the lifting up of a bronze snake is the lifting up of sin being judged, in the form of Jesus lifted up on the cross.

So, anyone looking at Jesus on the cross and believing in Him - will live - just like the Israelites lived when they looked at the bronze snake.

In our other the OT reading from Deut 18:15 - where God says he will raise a prophet like Moses - and the people must listen to Him - again this points to Jesus

And we must listen to Him!

We can listen to Him - by knowing Scripture which helps us to understand

Jesus - and to understand His death and resurrection

A challenge I'd like to throw out - we have plenty of time at home whilst we are isolated - we can find Jesus in every book in the Bible

I issued this challenge in our Bible Study - and I'm happy for you to email me what you find...

Understanding the Resurrection

You see <u>if</u> <u>we</u> **study Jesus' words** and **study His scriptures** - which are all about Him

[PowerPoint 5-The Resurrection]

We will understand some things about Jesus' resurrection

We will understand that Jesus' resurrection means Jesus sacrifice on the cross was perfect and complete - as we said on Good Friday - it is finished - means finished in the past, finished in the present and finished in the future. Sin is paid for once and for all - and so Jesus' resurrection means death is defeated.

- We will also understand that the cross was the <u>payment</u> for sin & death
 and the <u>empty tomb</u> is the <u>receipt</u> for that <u>payment</u> <u>Jesus has</u>
 bought us back to God at a price His life
- We will also understand that <u>death has no hold on anyone who believes</u>
 <u>in Jesus</u> so we <u>don't need to worry about dying</u>. Dying is gain we get
 to spend eternity with Jesus
- We will also understand that when God's love and humankind's hate battled at the cross God's love won!
- And we will also understand that <u>because</u> Jesus was raised from the dead
 <u>we can be resurrected too</u> as John 3:16 God loved the people of this world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who has faith in him will have eternal life and never really die.(CEV)

Conclusion

To finish up then

[PowerPoint 5-Conclusion]

If we're serious about studying and meditating on God's Word...

Our study of Scripture - in regards to the Resurrection should lead us to John 11 - where Jesus raises His friend Lazarus from the dead - and to where he tells Lazarus' sister, Martha, this:

⁵ ... "I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die; ²⁶ and whoever lives by believing in me will never die. Do you believe this?"

What a question!

A question for our unbelieving family and friends?

A question that everyone on this planet needs to answer?

And our study of Scripture in regards to the Resurrection should also lead us to 1 Corinthians 15 - Paul says this vv14-19

¹⁴ And if Christ has not been raised, our **preaching is useless** and **so is** your **faith**. ¹⁵ More than that, we are then found to be **false witnesses** about God, for we have testified about God that he raised Christ from the dead. But he did not raise him if in fact the dead are not raised. ¹⁶ For if the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised either. ¹⁷ And if Christ has not been raised, your **faith is futile**; you are **still in your sins**. ¹⁸ Then **those** also who have **fallen asleep in Christ are lost**. ¹⁹ If only for this life we have hope in Christ, we are of all **people** most to be **pitied**. Our **faith is futile** and we are **without hope** if Christ hasn't risen

But Paul says no! Christ has indeed been raised from the dead (v20)

And because Christ has been raised - anyone in Christ will be made alive too
(v22)

As 1 John 5:11-12 puts it:

¹¹ And this is the testimony: **God has given us eternal life**, and this life is **in his Son**. ¹² **Whoever has the Son has life**; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life.

Therefore, because of Jesus - we can join the Apostle Paul - in victory- and say as in 1 Cor 15:54-55

Death has been swallowed up in victory."

55 "Where, O death, is your victory?

Where, O death, is your sting?"

One final challenge - this morning - if someone was in the middle of the road and a truck was coming towards them - you would make sure they got out of the way of the truck, wouldn't you?

So, if you know someone who doesn't yet believe in Jesus - and they are going to die without knowing Jesus - are you going to let them miss out on eternal life - and get run over by the truck of sin and death? Or are you going to tell them how they can have the punishment for sin removed and how they can live forever with Jesus?

As our NSW Moderator - Richard Keith reminded us the other day

"The church buildings might be closed this Easter - but the Tomb is open
He is not here, He is risen!"
