1 Kings 10:14-29

Solomon's Splendour

¹⁴ The weight of the gold that Solomon received yearly was 666 talents, ¹⁵ not including the revenues from merchants and traders and from all the Arabian kings and the governors of the territories.

¹⁶ King Solomon made two hundred large shields of hammered gold; six hundred shekels of gold went into each shield. ¹⁷ He also made three hundred small shields of hammered gold, with three minas of gold in each shield. The king put them in the Palace of the Forest of Lebanon.

¹⁸ Then the king made a great throne covered with ivory and overlaid with fine gold. ¹⁹ The throne had six steps, and its back had a rounded top. On both sides of the seat were armrests, with a lion standing beside each of them. ²⁰ Twelve lions stood on the six steps, one at either end of each step. Nothing like it had ever been made for any other kingdom. ²¹ All King Solomon's goblets were gold, and all the household articles in the Palace of the Forest of Lebanon were pure gold. Nothing was made of silver, because silver was considered of little value in Solomon's days. ²² The king had a fleet of trading ships at sea along with the ships of Hiram. Once every three years it returned, carrying gold, silver and ivory, and apes and baboons.

²³ King Solomon was greater in riches and wisdom than all the other kings of the earth. ²⁴ The whole world sought audience with Solomon to hear the wisdom God had put in his heart. ²⁵ Year after year, everyone who came brought a gift—articles of silver and gold, robes, weapons and spices, and horses and mules.

²⁶ Solomon accumulated chariots and horses; he had fourteen hundred chariots and twelve thousand horses, which he kept in the chariot cities and also with him in Jerusalem. ²⁷ The king made silver as common in Jerusalem as stones, and cedar as plentiful as sycamore-fig trees in the foothills. ²⁸ Solomon's horses were imported from Egypt and from Kue—the

royal merchants purchased them from Kue at the current price. ²⁹ They imported a chariot from Egypt for six hundred shekels of silver, and a horse for a hundred and fifty. They also exported them to all the kings of the Hittites and of the Arameans.

¹⁹ "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moths and vermin destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. ²⁰ But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moths and vermin do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal. ²¹ For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

Intro

- Where is your treasure?
- What do you treasure most in your life?
- Your husband or wife? Your children? Your grandchildren? Your Mum or Dad?
- Maybe your home? Your car? Your boat? Your caravan? Your holiday place?
- Or maybe you have a **treasured possession**?
- Or maybe you collect stuff?

- Since I've arrived in Australia, I've noticed **Aussies are great collectors** (hoarders?)
- Not sure why? Perhaps originally it was because of Australia's remoteness so
 people hang on to stuff as their security?
- But with the world more accessible through travel and technology perhaps
 collecting stuff is just part of Aussie culture now
- Now it's okay to have treasures <u>but</u> <u>what if</u> those treasurers begin to <u>replace</u>
 God <u>and</u> to <u>replace</u> His Son, <u>Jesus</u>?

(pause)

- As we look at our passage this morning from 1 Kings 10:14-29 we see Solomon's treasures
- And <u>let's be clear from the start</u> <u>everything</u> Solomon has is a <u>blessing from</u>
 God
- Remember back in chapter 3 God told Solomon he could ask for anything
- Solomon asked for wisdom and God answered and gave Solomon wisdom –
 and God also gave Solomon wealth and honour as well!
- So, we can't really blame Solomon for being blessed with all this treasure
- But what if Solomon loses his heart to this treasure and his heart is no longer for
 God?
- Well, let's look at Solomon's treasure and see ...

Solomon's Treasure (1 Kings 10:14-29)

Annual Income (vv14-15)

• First then, Solomon's annual income

[PowerPoint 1-Income]



- He receives 666 talents of gold 25 tons (800,000 oz.) = almost \$2 billion dollars
 at today's prices but remember gold is a lot more expensive now than it was in
 Solomon's day
- Solomon's annual income <u>doesn't</u> include other revenue <u>from</u> merchants and traders - and royal taxes from Arabian kings and governors of the territories
- In comparison, today, the **Queen** gets an **annual income** of about **£8 million** (\$15 million) from the British government
- **PM** gets **\$526,000** per annum
- Premier gets \$407,000 per annum
- And the Minimum wage in Australia is \$40,000 per annum
- So, we can see Solomon's income and wealth is breathtaking [however Elon
 Musk [CEO of Tesla and SpaceX) gets \$6.6 billion dollars per annum]

Shields (vv16-17)

[PowerPoint 2-Shields]



Solomon's treasure <u>also includes</u> 200 large shields of hammered gold and 300 small shields of hammered gold – the large shields are worth \$602,000 each and the small shields are worth \$148,000 each

Throne (vv18-20)

• Solomon also had an amazing ivory throne overlaid with gold

- Note that: elephants would have to die for this ivory to be used!
- The throne had **lion armrests** and **six steps** with lions on each step
- As people entered the Palace Solomon would be looking down on them from his throne – in a position of power and authority

Other Treasures (vv21-22)

And Solomon had other treasures

- Everything in the Palace was made of gold nothing was made of silver because
 silver was so cheap and common in Solomon's day
- As well as all of that every three years Solomon's fleet of trading ships returned with more gold and silver, ivory, apes and baboons
- We are meant to go WOW! That's why the writer is describing it!
- Wow wow wow!

The Assessment of Solomon (vv23-25)


- And that's why the writer makes an assessment of Solomon in vv23-25
- He says there is no king richer or wiser than Solomon anywhere in the world v23
- The whole world (hyperbole) came to Solomon to hear the wisdom God had put in his heart – v24
- Where did Solomon's wisdom come from? God!
- It begs the question where do we go for our wisdom?
- Remember that according to the Apostle Paul In Jesus is hidden all the treasures
 of wisdom and knowledge (Colossians 2:3)
- And <u>because</u> Solomon is the richest and wisest man in the world v25 <u>people</u>
 keep coming to him and he is given even more treasures

- Blessing upon blessing
- As I say we are meant to go WOW!
- But <u>maybe</u> <u>we're</u> <u>feeling a bit uncomfortable</u> <u>about all this treasure</u>? Or <u>even</u> <u>jealous</u>?

The Problem with Solomon's Treasure (vv26-29)

- And just as we are feeling a bit uncomfortable
- We **hit** a **problem** in vv26-29

[PowerPoint 5-Problem]



- We read that Solomon accumulates a whole heap of chariots and horses 1400
 chariots and 12,000 horses
- What's wrong with that?
- Well back in the book of Deuteronomy 17:16-17 way before Israel ever had a king –
 God warned the people through Moses

The king, moreover, must not acquire great numbers of horses for himself or make the people return to Egypt to get more of them, for the LORD has told you, "You are not to go back that way again." He must not take many wives, or his heart will be led astray. He must not accumulate large amounts of silver and gold.

- So, any King of Israel was not to accumulate horses they were to rely on God's strength not their army's strength and they were not to return to Egypt for them
- Where does Solomon get his horses and chariots from? V28 from Egypt!
- Any King of Israel was not to accumulate silver and gold because it will become something to worship and obsess about
- Also, any King of Israel was not to take many wives or his heart will be led astray
- If we skip to the next chapter 1 Kings 11:4 we read...

As Solomon grew old, his wives turned his heart after other gods, and his heart was not fully devoted to the LORD his God, as the heart of David his father had been.


- So, what we are meant to see here in this chapter (10)
- Yes, Solomon has been blessed greatly <u>BUT</u> <u>he's also disobeying God's</u>
 commands he's gone back to Egypt and got horses He's accumulated silver and gold He's taken many wives and they are foreign wives worshipping foreign gods and they are princess from other nations all wanting their own <u>luxurious lifestyle</u>
 and wanting their own stuff (treasures) and wanting their own gods
- And Solomon can pretend he won't be influenced by them but it's impossible not to be!
- And yes Solomon could justify accumulating horses and chariots and say Yes, I imported horses from Egypt but look at v29 I exported them I didn't keep them for myself
- But I bet he made a nice profit from them! And he is still breaking God's rules!
- You see <u>once we start watering down God's rules</u> <u>we are on a slippery slope</u>

- For example, we've watered down sexuality and marriage in the last few years –
 where's that got us?
- So, what we are meant to see is Solomon's heart is subtly and gradually being stolen by earthly treasures and he is no longer making God his number one treasure
- And we are meant to see that this could easily happen to us too!

Jesus – our Treasure (Matthew 6:19-21)

- Jesus has something to say about treasure in our NT reading from Matt 6:19-21
- [Please turn there now]
- Look at v19

"Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moths and vermin destroy, and where thieves break in and steal.

- Here's my treasure box
- I may have some treasures in there
 - Photos of my parents and grandparents but they are starting to look a bit
 faded and cracked and you know what I can't really make out the faces

that well anymore – you might say – store them on a computer – oh yeah – what happens when the hard drive goes – I have a backup – oh what happens when the backup disappears – I still have them on a floppy disk somewhere – but oh, we don't use them anymore

- I have some letters from my mum and dad but every time I take them out
 they are falling apart more and more
- I used to have a gold watch of my dad's but about 15 years ago just before
 Christmas we had a break in at home and the burglars stole it
- I hung on to some of Dad's tools but they're all rusty now
- That's Jesus' point we can hang on to stuff (our treasure) in our life on Earth but
 everything we have on this Earth is temporary all our stuff doesn't last even we
 don't last we start breaking down and need new hips and knees and transplants
 and glasses and walking sticks and walkers
- And notice Jesus says "do not store up treasures for YOURSELVES on earth"
- In other words it's okay to have treasures on Earth <u>but don't be selfish</u> about it and in doing so - lose sight of God
- Isn't that what Solomon ended up like he became selfish yes, his whole country was thriving silver was cheap as chips everyone was thriving but the more we have the more selfish and greedier we can become and the further away from God we become

BUT STORE UP FOR YOURSELVES
TREASURES IN HEAVEN WHERE
MOTHS AND VERMIN DO NOT

- So, Jesus says we are to do something else instead in v20:
- But store up for yourselves treasures in <u>heaven</u>, where moths and vermin do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal.
- What might be the **treasures** we can **store** in **heaven**?
- Well, I have my treasure box for Heaven <u>let's see</u>
 - I will commit my time to God and share my faith in Jesus with others so
 they believe in Jesus too and they get to be forgiven and live forever with
 Jesus in Heaven
 - I will commit my time to praying for people who don't know Jesus so that they get to know Him and get to Heaven
 - I will commit my time to reading the Bible so I can explain to people why I
 believe in Jesus and how to get to Heaven
 - I will commit to pleasing God first and valuing His opinion of me and not
 pleasing people and valuing their opinion of me
 - I will commit to giving money to the church and to missions and to those in need
 - o I will commit to being rich towards God and not rich towards myself
 - I will commit to sharing my stuff (my treasure) with others my house is their house – my car is their car – my clothes are their clothes – my food is their

food – we only have our stuff (our treasure) in the first place – because God allows it!

- I will commit to showing the love of Jesus showing forgiveness to those who
 hurt me and as far as it depends on me, I will commit to living at peace with
 everyone I know
- o I will commit to using my God-given talents to help and teach others
 - If I'm good at teaching the Bible I'll volunteer to teach scripture at school or teach kids in youth ministry
 - If I'm good with finance and business I'll volunteer on the COM or help others with their budgeting
 - If I'm good at music I'll teach others to play an instrument or to sing
 - If I'm good at hospitality I'll cook food for those sick in our church or provide morning tea – or donate to the food hampers
 - If I'm a good listener I'll phone or visit someone who is sad or grieving or lonely
 - If I'm good at praying I'll commit to praying for others
- God wants us to use and share our talents not keep them to ourselves
- As <u>Jesus reminds us</u> in Matt 10:42

And if anyone gives even a cup of cold water to one of these little ones who is my disciple, truly I tell you, that person will certainly not lose their reward.

- Storing up treasures in Heaven means bringing glory to God not glory to ourselves
- It means being a sign-post to Jesus not a sign-post to ourselves
- As <u>Jesus reminds us</u> in Matt 25:40

Whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me

- Jesus is saying that the things we do for others He sees them from Heaven and
 they last forever these are heavenly treasures
- Jesus finishes his short teaching on treasure by making a very telling remark in v21
 [PowerPoint 8-Matt 6:21]



For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

- And so, we come back to my first question
- Where is your treasure?
- <u>Jesus is saying</u> **whatever you treasure most in life** <u>that's where your heart really is</u>
- Can we do an honest assessment this morning?
- <u>Is our first treasure Jesus?</u> Or is <u>something or someone</u> captivating our heart <u>and</u>
 <u>leading our heart away from Jesus?</u>
- Remember Jesus left His Heavenly glory to come to this Earth to lay down His life
 so we can have the treasure of eternal life in Heaven!
- Let's pray...

We're sorry for the times we have got sucked in by the treasures and trappings here on Earth

We're sorry for the times we haven't shared our stuff with others

We're sorry for being a bit slow or reluctant in sharing our faith in Jesus

Help us through the power of your Holy Spirit to build treasures in Heaven by sharing the
love of Jesus to others — and by sharing with people the reason for the certain hope of

Heaven we have — because of Jesus' grace and mercy in dying on the cross for our sins to
be forgiven and rising to life — so we can live forever with Him in Heaven.
