### The Birth of Jesus Foretold

<sup>26</sup> In the sixth month of Elizabeth's pregnancy, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, <sup>27</sup> to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David. The virgin's name was Mary. <sup>28</sup> The angel went to her and said, "Greetings, you who are highly favoured! The Lord is with you."

<sup>29</sup> Mary was greatly troubled at his words and wondered what kind of greeting this might be. <sup>30</sup> But the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary; you have found favour with God. <sup>31</sup> You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to call him Jesus. <sup>32</sup> He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, <sup>33</sup> and he will reign over Jacob's descendants forever; his kingdom will never end."

34 "How will this be," Mary asked the angel, "since I am a virgin?"

<sup>35</sup> The angel answered, "The Holy Spirit will come on you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the holy one to be born will be called the Son of God. <sup>36</sup> Even Elizabeth your relative is going to have a child in her old age, and she who was said to be unable to conceive is in her sixth month. <sup>37</sup> For no word from God will ever fail."

<sup>38</sup> "I am the Lord's servant," Mary answered. "May your word to me be fulfilled." Then the angel left her.

# **Mary Visits Elizabeth**

<sup>39</sup> At that time Mary got ready and hurried to a town in the hill country of Judea, <sup>40</sup> where she entered Zechariah's home and greeted Elizabeth. <sup>41</sup> When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the baby leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. <sup>42</sup> In a loud voice she exclaimed: "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the child you will bear! <sup>43</sup> But why am I so favoured, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? <sup>44</sup> As soon as the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the baby in my womb leaped for joy. <sup>45</sup> Blessed is she who has believed that the Lord would fulfill his promises to her!"

# Mary's Song

46 And Mary said:

"My soul glorifies the Lord

- and my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour,
- <sup>48</sup> for he has been mindful of the humble state of his servant.

From now on all generations will call me blessed,

- for the Mighty One has done great things for me—holy is his name.
- <sup>50</sup> His mercy extends to those who fear him, from generation to generation.
- <sup>51</sup> He has performed mighty deeds with his arm; he has scattered those who are proud in their inmost thoughts.
- <sup>52</sup> He has brought down rulers from their thrones but has lifted up the humble.
- <sup>53</sup> He has filled the hungry with good things but has sent the rich away empty.
- <sup>54</sup> He has helped his servant Israel, remembering to be merciful

<sup>55</sup> to Abraham and his descendants forever, just as he promised our ancestors."

<sup>56</sup> Mary stayed with Elizabeth for about three months and then returned home.

### Intro

- Predicting the future can be quite tricky I think we've all experienced this during these COVID times
- Every time someone says we've broken the back of COVID something else
   happens you'd be very game to predict the future right now
- Here's some epic failures when it comes to predicting the future
  - King George II said in 1773 that the American colonies had little stomach for a revolution
  - One of the officials of the White Star Shipping Company <u>said</u> the Titanic was unsinkable
  - An English professor in the 19<sup>th</sup> century said that air travel at high speed would be impossible because passengers would suffocate
  - o In **2006** The **New York Times** declared "everyone is asking **when Apple** will come out with a **mobile phone**, the <u>answer</u> is "**probably, never**". The apple **iPhone came out** the **next year** (2007)
  - In 1943 Thomas Watson the president of IBM said "I think there's a world market for maybe <u>five</u> computers"

- In 1903 the president of Michigan Bank told people not to invest in the
   Ford Motor company because "the horse is here to stay and the automobile is only a novelty just a fad"
- Thankfully God's predictions aren't like that What He says WILL come to pass in His own good and perfect time and it doesn't matter even if what God predicts seems unlikely impossible even outrageous we can be confident it WILL happen

### God's "Sign" Revealed (Isaiah 7:14)

- In our OT reading from Isaiah 7:14 the prophet Isaiah reveals a "sign" from God
  of something that will happen in the future
- The date of Isaiah's prophecy is about 735 BC
- God says this to Isaiah

- So, God's "sign" is that a VIRGIN will conceive
- Some people will say that the **Hebrew word** translated as Virgin (almah) can mean "young woman" and not necessarily a "virgin"
- However, in the Bible when this word is used it's always to do with a woman
   who is unmarried and therefore a virgin

- For example, in Gen 24:43 the word is <u>used</u> when Isaac is seeking a bride to marry
- So, God's sign is a virgin will conceive and have a son
- As much as this might sound impossible
- God is in the miracle business
- We can't do miracles only God can
- As we read about His Miracles in the Bible we can either reject them as some
   do or accept them
- If we accept them that is FAITH
- Faith is believing in something that you can't explain or can't see
- And trusting that God always says and does the truth
- And even more miraculous
- This baby son will have the title Immanuel meaning "God is with us"
- Somehow this baby will be God living with His people

# God's "Sign" Confirmed (Luke 1:26-37)

- So, we fast forward 700 or so years to around about 4 or 5 BC
- To our **NT passage** from **Luke 1:26-56** [Please turn there now]
- We pick up the story where the context is we've just been told that a lady called
   Elizabeth is 6 months pregnant
- She is married to Zechariah and is expecting a son who will be John the Baptist
- Then v26 God sends an angel one of His messengers called Gabriel to a
  place called Nazareth

- To speak to a virgin [there's that word again] called Mary who is pledged to be married to a man called Joseph
- We're <u>not told</u> how old either Mary or Joseph are <u>or</u> how long they've been engaged
- Gabriel says Mary is highly favoured and God is with her
- Mary is troubled by these words from the angel and by his greeting
- It's a bit <u>like me saying to you</u> "You're just the person I need have I got a job for you" you'd be thinking "Oh no what does he want me to do am I up to the challenge?"
- But Gabriel reassures Mary there's nothing to be afraid of she has found favour
   with God
- The word used for favour is the Greek word for grace
- Grace is God's merciful kindness on people
- God could have chosen any woman but <u>in His grace</u> and <u>kindness</u> God chose
   Mary
- Basically, it's a privilege for Mary to be God's servant
- Then the angel Gabriel confirms the "sign" that God gave Isaiah over 700 years
   earlier

- See v31
- Gabriel says Mary will conceive and give birth to a Son and call him JESUS
- From this we can say with confidence: God always keeps His promises His prophecies and predictions will always come true in His own perfect timing and His own perfect and sometimes miraculous and supernatural way
- The name Jesus is from the Hebrew name "Yeh-ho-shoo'-ah" which means "God is Salvation" or "God saves"
- Jesus' name is a picture of what He will grow up to do
- To save people from the punishment of their sins by dying on a cruel cross
- The Angel goes on to say some amazing things about Jesus
- See v32 Jesus will be great literally He will be <u>MEGA</u>
- We can't underestimate how great how mega Jesus is
- Here's how Charles Spurgeon puts it
- No one has influenced history more than Jesus Christ. "Is it not proven that he is great? Conquerors are great, and he is the greatest of them. Deliverers are great, and he is the greatest of them. Liberators are great, and he is the greatest of them. Saviours are great, and he is the greatest of them." (Spurgeon)
- Gabriel also says:
  - Jesus will be called the Son of the Most High so Jesus is not only Mary's son but He will be known as the Son of God that fulfils what Isaiah said about the baby having the title Immanuel "God with us"
  - And Jesus will also reign on His ancestor King David's throne <u>forever</u> again fulfilling another promise that God made to King David <u>over 1000</u>
     <u>years earlier</u> that someone would be on his throne forever
  - That's <u>only possible because</u> God has sent His son to be born of Mary –
     who belongs to King David's family tree

- And it's <u>only possible</u> that Jesus reigns forever <u>because</u> He has existed forever – He was there at the creation of the Earth – and He continues forever
- Rightly v34 Mary is wondering how she is going to have a baby and yet still remain a virgin
- So **Gabriel explains** in v35 exactly how this will happen
- The child Mary will conceive will be through the power of the Holy Spirit
- Gabriel says the power of the Most High (that's God) will overshadow her
- Note overshadow here means literally covered with a cloud we saw that in
   Solomon's temple when the presence of God entered the temple it was in a cloud
- It's hard for us to know from this one verse exactly what happens we can talk
   about Mary's DNA and God's DNA and whether Mary's egg is fertilized by God or
   is she just a vessel carrying baby Jesus and we can talk about whether Jesus is 50%
   from God and 50% from Mary but we'd really only be speculating
- And <u>as I said earlier</u> we accept God's supernatural stuff <u>in FAITH</u>
- However, we can say a few things for sure
  - It is a supernatural event
  - Mary becomes pregnant by the power of the Holy Spirit rather than by having intercourse with Joseph
  - That the child in her womb is from God and is God's Son as well as
     Mary's son
  - That the child is fully human see 1 Tim 2:5
  - And more importantly the child is <u>fully</u> God see John 1:1, 14; John 10:30, 33;
     Phil 2:5-6; John 17:21; John 1:18; Col 2:9-10;
  - And <u>because the child is fully God</u> He is <u>without</u> sin see Heb 4:15; 1 Peter
     2:22; 2 Cor 5:21; 1 John 3:5

- That bit is really really important because without Jesus being sinless He would not be able to be fully obedient to God and He would not be able to be the perfect once and for all sacrifice for sin
- And so, without this supernatural event of the virgin birth and without the
   birth of sinless Jesus we would have no forgiveness and no eternal life
- Gabriel than goes on to confirm God's supernatural activity by telling Mary in v36
   that even Mary's cousin, Elizabeth, who is an older woman and has been unable to have a baby is also pregnant
- And Gabriel confirms what we should already know in v37 that "no word from God will ever fail" some translations say "for nothing is impossible for God" and that's the bottom line isn't it "nothing is impossible for God" that's what we can hang on today as we face an uncertain future we don't know what lies ahead we don't know what trials we will face we may have COVID anxiety we may rightly get upset by the tragedies we hear and see we may have concerns about our climate or the threat of China but God is still on the throne and nothing is impossible for Him

## The Response to God's "Sign" (Luke 1:38-56)

- So, we've had God's sign revealed by Isaiah
- And we've had God's sign confirmed by the angel Gabriel
- Now <u>let's look at</u> the <u>response</u> to God's sign

- And we'll look at Elizabeth's response, John the Baptist's response, Mary's response, and finish up by asking ourselves what our response should be
- So first, Elizabeth's response...

### Elizabeth's Response

- When Mary visits her cousin Elizabeth
- Before Mary can say anything Elizabeth knows through the power of God's Holy
   Spirit:
  - o that Mary has been blessed by God and been shown great favour by God
  - She knows that the child Mary is carrying is blessed by God and that the baby is the <u>Lord</u>
  - And Elizabeth feels blessed that Mary would come to her carrying the Lord in her tummy
- How does Elizabeth know all this? Because God is in the miracle business!

### John the Baptist's response

- Second, there's John the Baptist's response
- John is not mentioned by name in the passage but he's there inside Elizabeth's tummy

- Look at John's response in v41 when Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting the unborn baby John leapt in his mother's womb and acknowledged the unborn Lord Jesus in Mary's womb how amazing is that
- This is <u>only possible because</u> the Holy Spirit communicates to the unborn John that
   Mary is carrying the Son of God!

## Mary's Response

- Third, there's Mary's response
- Look at v38 when she heard from the angel Gabriel, she was going to have God's
   Son
- Mary is humble and accepting "I am the Lord's servant" and "may your word to me be fulfilled"
- Then during her visit to Elizabeth Mary breaks into song in verses 46 to 55
- This song is known as Mary's Magnificat based on the Latin translation of the first words of her song "My soul magnifies the Lord"
- Mary's song shows that through the Holy Spirit she knows God's Word
- In summary she says:
  - o God is her Saviour
  - $\circ$  <u>God</u>, the Mighty One **has done great things** and for her v49
  - His Name is Holy v49
  - His mercy extends throughout generations v50 see Exodus 20:6; Psalm
     103:17
  - He has performed mighty deeds with His arm v51 see Psalm 98:1; Isaiah
     40:10
  - He **scatters the proud** v51 see Gen 11:8; Exodus 18:11; 2 Sam 22:28
  - He brings down rulers and lifts up the humble v52

- He feeds the hungry and sends the rich away emptyhanded v53 see Psalm
   107:9
- He has been **loving** and **faithful** and **merciful** to Israel v54 see Psalm 98:3
- o He **keeps His promises**, just like He did for Abraham
- o All this shows us that Mary knew God's Word and His Word was in her heart!

### Our Response

- So how should we **respond** this morning **to God's sign in sending Jesus**?
  - <u>Like Mary</u> <u>we</u> can be humble unquestioning servants of God <u>accepting</u>
     <u>His Word</u>, <u>however strange</u> or <u>unlikely</u> it might seem, in human terms and accept that God is in the miracle business and we simply walk <u>in faith</u> and not by sight
  - Our response <u>should be like Mary's</u> <u>we must also</u> say "I am the Lord's servant" "may your word to me be fulfilled"
  - We too are blessed we have God's grace on us because Jesus is available to us too
  - Like Mary we <u>need to acknowledge</u> that we need Jesus as our <u>Saviour</u> –
     so that our sins are forgiven and we can have eternal life
  - And <u>like Mary does in her song</u> the Magnificat <u>it us good for us to recall</u>
     <u>God's mighty acts from history</u> and to <u>recall how He has worked in our lives</u>

     <u>in the past</u> to **remind ourselves how truly awesome God is**. <u>God deserves</u>
     our constant thanks and praise.

### Let me pray...

Father thank you that you revealed your plan to send Jesus in the Old Testament.

Thank you that in your own perfect timing and in your own perfect way — you brought Your Son to this Earth — through the power of the Holy Spirit — and through a virgin called Mary.

Thank you that in your grace and love and mercy – you made this happen – so that Jesus could be our Lord and our Saviour – and grow up to give us forgiveness of our sins – and grant us eternal life.

Help us to respond with humble servant-like hearts – walking by faith – not by sight. In Jesus' name, we pray. AMEN.
