Doxology

- ³⁶ For from him and through him and for him are all things. To him be the glory forever! Amen.

Sermon: "From Theology to Doxology"

Please turn your Bible to Romans chapter 11 – we're looking at verses 33-36.

There is an **outline** if you would like to take down some notes!

Let me **pray** first...

<u>Intro</u>

[Slide-Intro]

For **11 chapters** the **Apostle Paul** has given a **comprehensive account** of the **Gospel** – the **Good News of Jesus**.

Step by step Paul has shown how God revealed His way of putting sinners right with Himself, how Jesus died for our sins and was raised for us to be justified – that is - put right with God - and declared not guilty of our sins.

And Paul has explained how we are united to Jesus in His death and resurrection, and how the Christian life is lived not <u>under</u> the law but <u>in</u> the Spirit; and how God plans to incorporate the fullness of Israel and the Gentiles into His Kingdom community.

Paul now stops for a breath – a bit <u>like</u> a climber reaching the summit of a mountain – and takes in what's around them. Paul stops and contemplates what God has done in sending His Son Jesus to rescue us!

Those **11 chapters** are what we call **theology**.

[Slide-Theology]

Theology is "the study of God"

The word *theology* comes from two Greek words

Theos = "God" - and

Logia = "speaking words" or "the study of"

So, Paul has spent 11 chapters – literally "speaking words about God"

[Slide-theology to doxology]

Now in vv33-36 of chapter 11 – Paul moves from theology to doxology

So, we need to define doxology...

[Slide-doxology]

Doxology is "speaking praise or giving glory"

Again, the word doxology comes from two Greek words

Doxa = "Glory"

Logia = "speaking words" or "the study of"

So, in our case here – *doxology* is "*speaking praise to God or giving glory to <u>God</u>"

That's <u>what</u> Paul is doing in these verses (vv33-36)*

[Slide-When?]

When DO WE do doxology – and "speak praises to God and give glory to God"?

Well – a few places:

During our <u>worship services</u> – through our <u>prayers</u> – through the <u>hymns</u> we sing – we <u>even</u> sing a <u>doxology</u> after the collection to praise God for His provision for our church family

- Also, when we pray prayers usually consist of 4 parts Adoration,
 Confession, Thanks and Supplication. Our prayers of <u>Adoration</u> and <u>Thanks</u>
 give praise and glory to God don't they?
- Also when we speak about how God has worked in our lives we are giving glory to God!
- And when we read God's Word there are many places where we read about praise and glory to God – especially in the psalms

We might hear on the news of a **sportsperson** or **sports team** having **World Cup glory** – but what does glory mean – when glory is **related to God**.

[Slide-Glory to God?]

Again, in can mean a number of things:

- It can mean recognizing, acknowledging and declaring God's greatness,
 worthiness, and authority. Giving God all the credit for who He is and what
 He does!
- It can mean - God's inherent majesty and splendour often depicted in the Bible as a radiant light of dazzling brilliance that emanates from God, symbolizing His supreme beauty, holiness, and the overwhelming magnificence of His presence.
- <u>It can mean</u> God's visible and tangible manifestation of His presence. In the Bible, God's glory is revealed in various forms: such as a pillar of cloud and fire that guided the Israelites through the wilderness (Exodus 13:21-22);

Also, **God's glory that filled the tabernacle and the temple** (Exodus 40:34-35; 1 Kings 8:10-11) and **God's presence at the transfiguration** (Matthew 17:1-9)

- <u>It can mean</u> the glory we see in **God's creation** like the planets/stars; nature; animals; humans/babies!
- And it can mean God's glory that is reflected in the lives of believers
 through their actions, character and witness. Christians are called to live a life
 in a way that honours God and makes His glory known to others (Matthew
 5:16; 1 Corinthians 10:31)

(pause)

So, <u>we've said</u> – <u>what theology</u> is – <u>what doxology</u> is – and <u>what God's glory is...</u>

Now <u>we can look at Paul's doxology</u> – and he gives praise and glory to God in these 4 verses

Let's look at each verse in a bit of detail...

The Doxology

[Slide-V33]

V33 - Oh, the depth of the riches of the wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable his judgments, and his paths beyond tracing out!

Here Paul is giving glory to God for **His superior** wisdom and knowledge.

It's a bit like what **God says** in Isaiah 55:8 – "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways"

You see – God knows the big picture – He knows the beginning and the end – and every detail in between. He knows what lies ahead.

We don't know all of this. And **His judgments and the paths He plans for each of**us – are completely beyond our understanding.

For example – who would have seen the depths of riches of God's wisdom hidden in Jesus – by sending Jesus to die on a cruel cross?

<u>From a human perspective</u> this **seems foolish** – but **God had a plan** that His perfect Son would die for the sins of the world. <u>No-one</u> saw that coming! <u>No-one</u> realized until later what Jesus had actually achieved by His death and resurrection!

In our **Old Testament reading** from **Psalm 139:1-6** [Please turn there now]— King David says this:

- God is the one who really knows us intimately not even our husband or wife or family know us like God does
- God knows when we leave home and when we come back we're never out of sight!
- God knows what we will do and he even knows what we're thinking (that's scary isn't it?)
- God knows all our little ways and idiosyncrasies
- He even knows what we are going to say next!
- The fact that **God knows everything (omniscient)** and **He is everywhere we go (omnipresent) is too difficult for us to understand** King David says. We

just need to accept it – and give Him glory and praise for His superior wisdom and knowledge

And we need to stop being wise in our own eyes – and always come to Him for His wisdom – and pray before EVERY decision we make!
 It's silly for us to not come to God for His superior wisdom – isn't it?

 (pause)

[Slide-V34]

V34 - Who has known the mind of the Lord? Or who has been his counselor?

Here Paul is giving glory to God – for His superior mind!

God's mind is so superior to any human being – He doesn't need to go to a counsellor for help or advice.

And it's <u>pretty foolish of us</u> to give God advice <u>if His mind is superior to ours</u> – and it's <u>also silly of us</u> to suggest to Him that He doesn't know what He's doing <u>or</u> that He's made a mistake! And yet <u>we</u> do – <u>sometimes</u> – <u>don't we</u>? (pause)

[Slide-V35]

V35 - Who has ever given to God, that God should repay them?

Here Paul is giving glory to God because everything we have comes from Him – We don't give God anything. We wouldn't have anything – if He hadn't given it to us in the first place.

In our Bible Study/Growth Groups we discussed the fact – that we can give God our love or praise. But when we think about that – we can only give God our love because He loved us first - and gave us the capacity to love.

Remember when Pontius Pilate said to Jesus "Don't you realize I have power either to free you or to crucify you?" (John 19:10)

<u>Jesus replied</u>: "You would have no power over me if it were not given to you from [God] above" (John 19:11)

(pause)

If a person is a **brilliant mathematician** or **scientist** or **musician** – it's only because **God blessed them with those gifts and talents**.

As soon as we start thinking we are so great that we can do "such great things" – we're actually making it about us – and taking the glory that belongs to God! (pause)

The final verse – is probably the **most mind-blowing** of the lot [Slide-V36]

V36 - For <u>from</u> him and <u>through</u> him and <u>for</u> him are all things. To him be the glory forever! Amen.

Here Paul is giving glory to God – because everything is about God!

<u>Everything</u> comes <u>from</u> **God**; <u>everything</u> that happens, happens <u>through</u> **God**; and <u>everything</u> that happens, happens <u>for</u> God!

If we ask <u>where</u> all things came from in the beginning – the <u>answer</u> is <u>from</u> God!

If we ask <u>how</u> all things came into being and remain together – the <u>answer</u> is <u>through</u> God!

If we ask <u>why</u> everything came into being, and <u>why</u> everything continues as it does

- the answer is **for** God!

Those three little <u>prepositions</u> – "from", "through" and "for" – show that God is the *Creator*, the *Sustainer* and *Heir* of everything. <u>God is</u> the *source*, the *means* and the *goal*. He is the Alpha and Omega and every letter of the alphabet in between.

We need to know our place!

[Slide-Omnis]

He's the only one that deserves all the glory (credit)

<u>In summary</u> - **God is** – *Omniscient [All Knowing]*- *Omnipotent [All powerful]*-*Omnipresent [Everywhere]*

We are so small – and - God is so big

Let's pause and see just how small we are!

[Slide-video of creation]

Our Responses

How should we **respond** this morning?

[Slide-Response 1]

1. I'm convicted this morning and maybe you are too. Don't question what God is doing or complain He doesn't know what He is doing. I'm convicted why I would ever question God when He is all-knowing, all-powerful and everywhere!

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[Slide-Response 2]

2. <u>I'm also convicted about how</u> I might put tickets on myself. <u>Don't</u> take the glory that belongs to God. We only <u>have anything or can do anything because</u>

God allowed us to and blessed us to do so!

[Slide-Response 3]

3. <u>In all of life</u> we must <u>always</u> give glory to God. <u>The theology</u> that Paul gave us of the Gospel of Jesus Christ in those 11 chapters – <u>drove</u> Paul to write a <u>doxology</u>. Again, <u>I'm convicted</u> that we <u>can't</u> receive that theology from Paul - without us also giving God our doxology.

On the one hand, there can be no doxology without theology – we can't give glory and praise to a God we don't know!

And on the other hand, there should be no theology that is not also followed by doxology. It's simply not right to just have a head knowledge of God — without a heart that also gives Him - glory and praise.

Theology and doxology are inseparable!

Challenge

I'm also moved to challenge us.

[Slide-Challenge]

How about we write a doxology – which gives glory and praise to God – for sending Jesus – and write it in such a way as it could be given to a non-Christian – and it would show them why they need to follow Jesus...

If you <u>write it down</u> and hand it to me – <u>or email</u> it to me – <u>I'll publish it in our bulletin as an insert!</u>

Conclusion

Let me – <u>finish</u> with **Psalm 150** – it's the <u>last Psalm in the Book of Psalms</u> – and it's <u>no coincidence</u> it's a doxology – and sums up what our worship and praise should be!

[Slide-Psalm 150:6]

Psalm 150

¹ Praise the LORD.

Praise God in his sanctuary;
praise him in his mighty heavens.

- ² Praise him for his acts of power; praise him for his surpassing greatness.
- ³ Praise him with the sounding of the trumpet, praise him with the harp and lyre,
- ⁴ praise him with timbrel and dancing, praise him with the strings and pipe,
- ⁵ praise him with the clash of cymbals, praise him with resounding cymbals.
- ⁶ Let everything that has breath praise the LORD.
